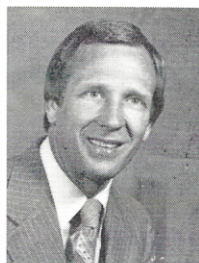

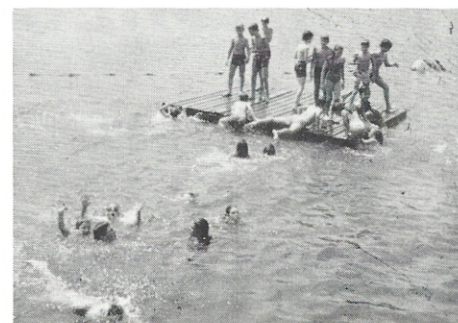

MUSIC MINISTRY

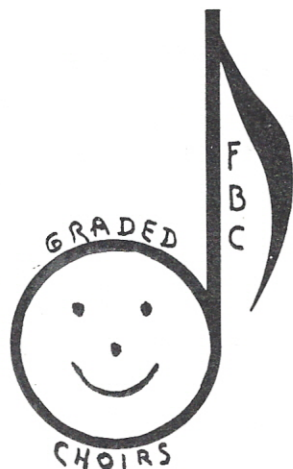

PARENTS OF GRADED CHOIR MEMBERS — This year is going to be a milestone in Graded Choirs of FBC. As we have mentioned before, Mrs. Flo Minchew, our Graded Choir Coordinator, has developed a program of instruction for the choirs which will lead the children into becoming a music reader by the time they are in 4th and 5th-grade choirs (Young Musicians). 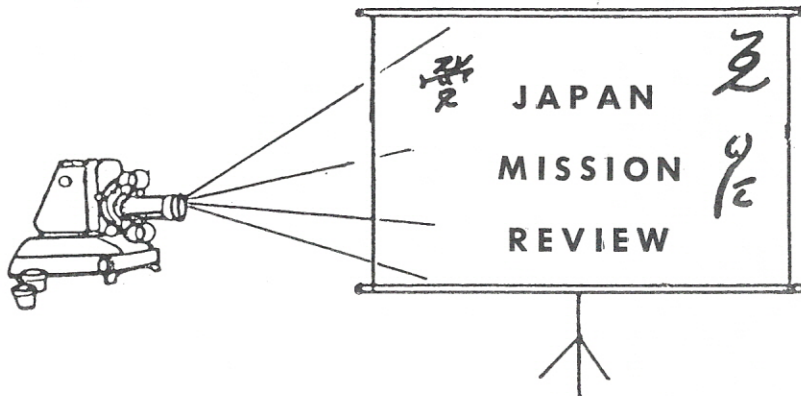
