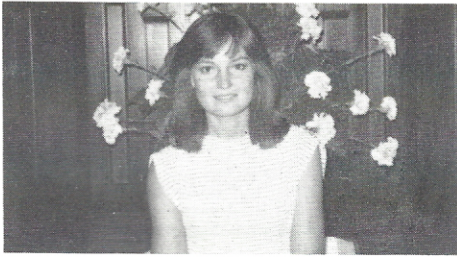

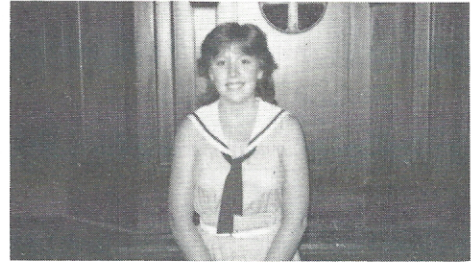

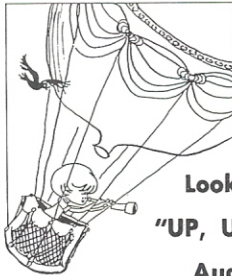
PLACE: Santa Rosa Gulf Islands National Seashore (State Park between Pensacola Beach and Navarre).

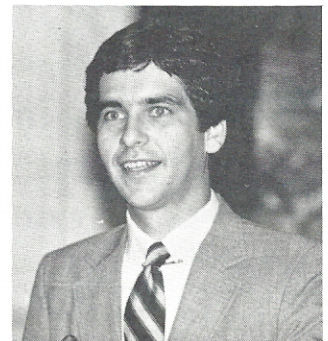

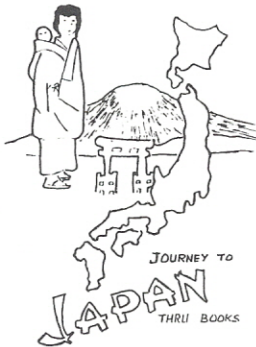
