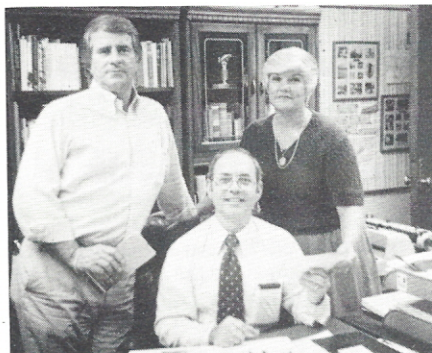

PARTNERSHIP EVANGELISM TEAM DEPARTS FOR JAPAN OCTOBER 25

Bob and Jean Askew and Bill Santo will work for a week (October 30 - November 6) with the congregation of the Edamitsu Baptist Church in Kitikyushu, Japan.

Bill will preach and lead the music for the "Evangelistic Assemblies" (what we would call revival services). Jean and Bob will work with students, housewives, discussion groups, and businessmen in various settings aimed at building up the small church and hoping for evangelistic opportunities.

Our team now has sufficient money to purchase 121 Japanese-English New Testaments to distribute.

Special Prayer Tryst

Our team has asked for prayer support during their entire endeavor, with special attention to the hour 9:00 - 10:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 29. That will be the 11:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon hour on Sunday in Japan when Bill will be giving the official greeting from our church to the Kitikyushu Christians. Here is an excerpt from that greeting:

"I bring warm and friendly greetings from your Christian brothers in America.

Especially, greetings come from First Baptist Church of Pensacola, Florida

The choir members from my church who visited Japan recently send you special greetings.

At this very hour, many Christian friends in Pensacola are praying for you and for me as I speak to you of their love for you."

The Edamitsu Baptist Church is very small (thirty members in attendance on Sunday), but our team of three workers will spend the entire week with this congregation. The goals for the week are many:

1. Encourage and support the Japanese Christians.
2. Encourage and support the Pastor, Osamu Matsukura.
3. Develop a choir for the church.
4. Draw unchurched and unsaved people to the "Evangelistic Assemblies".
5. Distribute 121 Japanese - English New Testaments.
6. Have 100 in attendance at the Friday, Saturday and Sunday Services.



Sorry, No More Lawn Parties!

From one of the books of history in the Bible comes the Scripture chosen to be our theme verse for the 1984 budget campaign. It says, "Every man should give as he is able, according to the blessing of the Lord thy God which he has given thee." Deuteronomy 16:17.

Church members who are sensitive about gentle reminders that giving money is an important part of the life of a Christian would have had a difficult time adjusting to practices utilized in years gone by and duly recorded in the history of the church.

Pledging a certain amount is a plan that seems to have been around in Baptist churches since before First Baptist Pensacola was founded; but the kicker is, that at the end of each month a tally was given to the church stating who had, and who had not, lived up to their word; AND if you were among the "had nots" you were required to submit, in writing, the reason. "Too poor" was the reason most often used. That was acceptable.

Later the monetary "quota system" became popular. Under this plan each active adult was assigned a certain amount to "secure." After a short time that plan proved unsuccessful, "due mainly to the methods used by some members to reach their quota." (No "methods" were specifically named in the minutes.)

Around the turn of the century it was not uncommon for the ladies of the church to be given the responsibility of raising money for the church. It was, in fact, their "duty" to raise the pastor's salary while the men accepted the burden of the "necessities."

In 1921, after years of trial and error, including trolley rides, lawn parties, Bay boat excursions, auctions, teas, coffees and even membership dues, someone came up with the idea of "following the original instructions" and the church wisely decided to adopt a "scriptural approach" for financing the church program.

On June 15, 1921, a resolution was passed that has been the basis of growth and support for the Lord's work here at First Baptist Church. The resolution reads: "Resolved: That the Bible teaching of stewardship with the tithe as the minimum of the Christian's obligation, be earnestly and affectionately commended to all members of this church as the basis of financial support."

As we approach the 1984 budget, we earnestly and affectionately remind you that is still God's plan and that that is still our plan. Please join in a unified effort of "Giving: A Spiritual Investment."

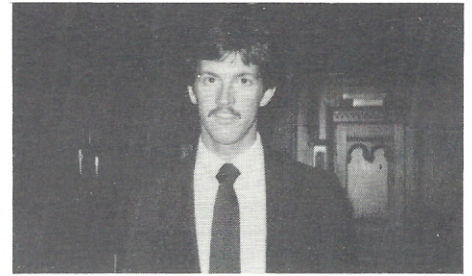
