Sunday's services were just outstanding. A special word of thanks goes to the Adult Choir for leading in our Flag ceremony on



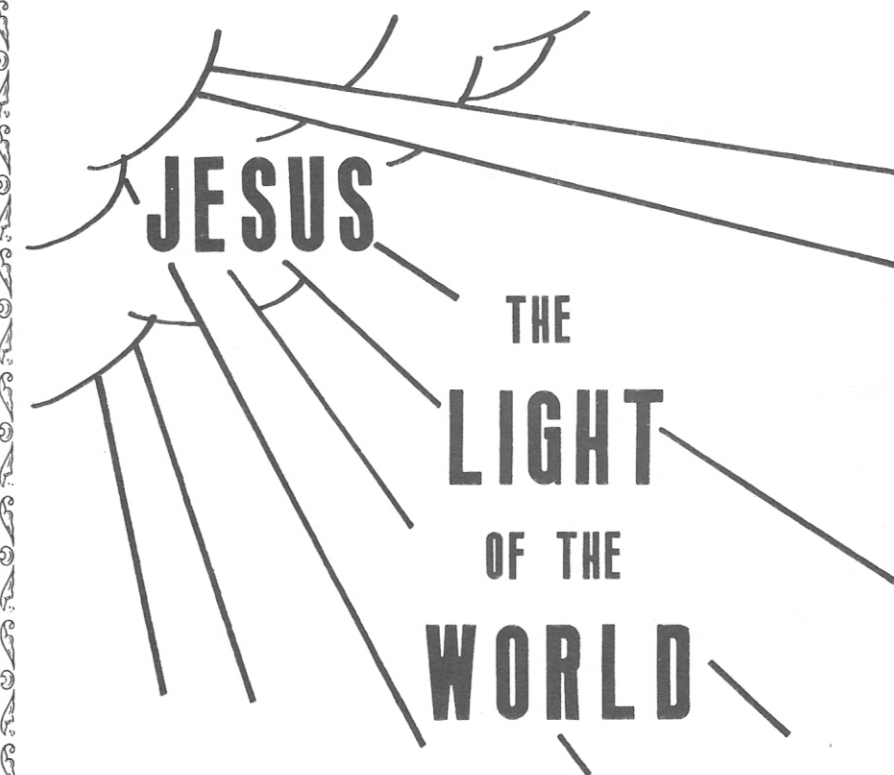
Sunday morning. The view of the flags of the nations at the end of the service helped us focus on the needs of the world. Ed Holt, head of our ushers, told me that we had one of our largest crowds of the Fall. I'm glad you were here.

THE PROGRAM SUNDAY NIGHT . . . was also a real blessing. The children sang well. The choir leadership has done an excellent job with our children this Fall. Thanks to Flo Minchew and all of the graded choir program workers for an outstanding program.

LOTTIE MOON . . . gave her life for the sake of missions. Therefore, it is so appropriate that her name is attached to the Christmas offering for Foreign Missions. Our goal this year is \$68,800. You can help us reach it if you will give generously and sacrificially. For each \$900 that you give to the Lottie Moon offering, one of the flags of the nations will be placed in the Sanctuary. When the total amount is given, there will be 75 flags in the Sanctuary plus the Christian flag. Let's show our colors this year!

IT WAS A THRILL . . . to me to mention Sunday morning all of our church members who have been involved in short term mission projects during 1983: Joan Peterson, Jane Varner, Frank Trotter, Jan and me, over 100 members of our Adult Choir, Mary Royals, Bob and Jean Askew, Bill Santo (and I hope I didn't leave out anyone else). We're praying for more of such involvement during 1984. Would you be interested in being involved in a partnership evangelism venture to another country next Fall? Would you be interested in spending a couple of weeks in some short term mission interest? If so, let me know.

BUDGET PLEDGING FOR 1984 . . . The final figures Charlotte Martin gave me this week look very good. As of December 2 our church members had pledged \$1,137,510, which is 83% of the 1984 budget. In addition to that, Charlotte checked the records to see how much was given in 1983 by those who did not pledge. This is expected income for 1984 over and above the amount pledged. This figure came to \$260,054. So when these two figures are added together,

the amount actually pledged for 1984 and the other amount that we can expect for 1984, the total figure is about \$1,399,000! That exceeds our 1984 budget, which is \$1,377,000. 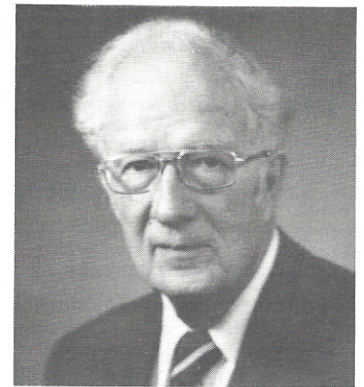

## E. DIXIE BEGGS ELECTED DEACON EMERITUS

### Distinct Honor for a Distinguished Gentleman

"Deacon Emeritus" is a position of honor for which  
a person becomes eligible when he has served at least  
four times as an elected deacon and reached the age  
of seventy.

The church policy for election of Deacons Emeritus  
states: "The position of Deacon Emeritus is intended  
to be an honorary position recognizing exceptional,  
exemplary, consecrated, consistent, dedicated, devout  
and effective service as a Christian, a church member  
and a deacon."



E. DIXIE BEGGS

E. Dixie Beggs joined First Baptist Church of Pensacola on February 11, 1917, and was  
ordained a deacon on January 8, 1939. He is the son of Judge E. D. and Lilly Clubbs Beggs.  
Mr. Beggs has taught the Master Workmen Bible Class since 1937, and has been  
President of our church corporation since 1976.

Mr. Beggs earned two degrees at University of Florida where he was President of the  
Student Body and a member of Phi Beta Kappa and ODK.

During his many years of active law practice, Mr. Beggs made a strong mark in many  
areas of service in his profession. He was President of the Florida Bar Association (1947-48)  
and also fulfilled many committee responsibilities with that organization and the American  
Bar Association — too numerous to list.

The service of Mr. Beggs also included serving as President of the Florida Baptist  
Foundation, Baptist Hospital of Pensacola and Pensacola Rotary Club.

He is respected by many because of his interest in community affairs, having served as:  
Board Member and Vice President of Pensacola Chamber of Commerce  
Director of Crippled Children's Home of Florida  
Director and Chairman of YMCA Board of Trustees  
President of Pensacola Council of Navy League  
Director in earlier years of Community Chest, local Salvation Army Post,  
Boy Scout Council, Girl Scout Council, the Red Cross
