

The response confirmed that this was so. By the way, with so many experiencing death in their family, let's be extra sensitive to their needs.



PARTNERSHIP EVANGELISM . . . One of the best ways to "do missions" is to participate in a partnership evangelism effort. In this type of program, a team from the States spends a week with a particular church in some other country. This approach provides the opportunity so make a significant impact on a particular community and to give strength to a particular church. In addition, it gives tremendous insight into what missions is all about. Bill Santo led a partnership group to Japan in 1983 and Eddie led the group to Korea in 1984. My plan is for us to go on at least one of these each year. We have made plans for our 1985 trip and I wanted to tell you about it so that some of you will prayerfully consider going. David Chism is going to lead a group to Ecuador this summer, July 25 - August 6. Melissa will be going with him, and we need two or three others from our church to team up with them in this mission effort. Each person will need to pay his or her own way. David said it will be approximately \$1,000 from Miami. If you are interested, please contact David or me and we will talk with you further about it. For some of you who are tired of just talking about missions and would like to become more personally involved, this is a great opportunity.




