

Approximately 3,790 missionaries serve throughout America. Approximately 300 staff and support personnel work full time in the HMB offices in Atlanta.

Operation of the HMB and its ministries costs \$4,775,000 per month; \$1,101,923 per week; \$156,557 per day; \$6,523 per hour; or \$109 per minute.
