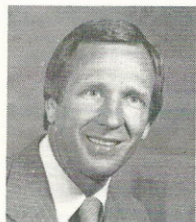

BOLD MISSION THRUST

Eight Years Old and Growing

Since Bold Mission Thrust was launched at the annual meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention in Norfolk, Virginia, in 1976, God has blessed the efforts of Southern Baptists.


The number of our churches has increased by almost five percent to a total of 36,740, our membership has grown by 11 percent to near 14.4 million members, and during this eight-year period Southern Baptists have baptized 3,064,616. This is a unique record among major denominations in the United States.

Look at the percentage increase in the number of church missions — up 170 percent. This is great. Our goal is 50,000 churches by the year 2000. The only way to reach this goal is by starting new churches.

A study of the following statistical record of Bold Mission Thrust from 1976 through 1984 will cause you to rejoice in what God has done and challenge you to want to do more.


