

The music, the mission presentation, and the fellowship time were all outstanding on Sunday night. I want to express a special word of appreciation to all of you who brought your favorite desserts on Sunday night. They were delicious (I didn't taste all of them, but I tried).



SCHOOL IS GOING AGAIN . . . and this is an exciting time for the church. We are going again with our strong Wednesday night program of music and missions for our children. We are planning for our 1986 budget. We are getting ready to elect our new deacons. We are enlisting teachers and preparing for promotion day on the first Sunday in October. It is an exciting time. Some of you have been gone during the summer months. I want to encourage you to come back this Sunday as we move into the fall season at the church.

MISSIONS . . . has always been the heartbeat of our church, and we are trying to keep current our missions interest and involvement through Partnership Evangelism. As David Chism explained Sunday night, Partnership Evangelism is a concept by which a team of a minister and some lay people go to a predetermined church to work with them from a Sunday through a Sunday. In that week's time, eternal benefits can be reaped as we learned from the report Sunday night about the work in Ecuador. Dot Walker is going to be leading a group next year to the Philippines. If you are interested, you need to make contact with her. This could not only be a life-changing experience for those with whom you share, but will also be a life-changing experience for you.

SINGLES . . . is a vital and dynamic part of our ministry at First Baptist Church. Charles Reed and a group of dedicated lay leaders are giving strong leadership to this part of our church life. I personally have been involved with singles ministry for many years and have had the privilege of speaking to several state singles' conferences and to the Singles' Labor Day Conference at Ridgecrest. This next weekend I will be going to Glorieta to speak to an estimated 3,000 singles over the weekend. I'll be speaking five times and I want you to pray for me. By the way, Charles Reed is also going to lead a conference. This will be a time when others can benefit from his expertise.
