What an unbelievable weekend this has been! We all feel like we have lived about a month or two of our lives these past few days. I was scheduled to speak at the Labor Day retreat for singles at Glorieta, New Mexico. Charles Reed was going with me to lead a conference. When Elena was coming toward Biloxi - Gulfport, we decided that we would try to get out on Thursday night. When it took a turn for Pensacola, we cancelled that flight. Then we can-



celled the Friday morning flight. By Friday afternoon, it looked like the crisis was over so we caught a plane to Glorieta Saturday morning. I spoke there on Saturday evening, and twice on Sunday. There were over 2,600 single adults from churches all over the Southwest. It was a thrilling experience. When we arrived back in Pensacola on Monday afternoon, we were relieved to discover that not much damage had been done. What a weekend!


CHRIST'S MANDATE TO SEEK AND SAVE



