

The emphasis on prayer in the services Sunday morning is one that we constantly need to make. Prayer is the practice that provides power for the people of God. Both as individual Christians and as a church, we need to continually recommit ourselves to a life of prayer. If you have not prayed lately, will you consider beginning today? Set aside a time in the morning or in the evening when you can get alone with God.



Follow the model that I shared recently on Wednesday night: praise, confession, thanksgiving, intercession, and commitment. The daily experience of prayer in your life will give strength and vision to your Christian life like nothing else will. Let's continue to be known as a praying church.


