SUNDAY, OCTOBER 6 — Youth Council luncheon at the home of Eddie and Jacki Benton immediately following the morning service for all youth council members.


SUNDAY, OCTOBER 6 — High School youth Drop-In immediately following the evening service at the CAC. Pizza will be served. The cost is \$1.00.
