MUSIC MINISTRY





SHARING — GOD'S WAY

Let's examine sharing — from God's perspective.

God's freedom cannot be experienced in the area of finances unless one:

- acknowledges God's ownership over everything and accepts the role of steward.
- surrenders the first part back to God.
- seeks the reason that God supplies him a surplus above his own basic needs.

We need to dispel some religious folklore that has developed about sharing. Christians stand on both sides of the tithing issue. On one side are the legalists who say that unless one tithes, he cannot join the "Christian Club." Tithing is sometimes elevated to the exclusion of virtually everything else. The theory is that tithing assures spirituality. But that is not the case. Examine what Christ said about some self-righteous men during His time. The Pharisees tithed down to even the last mint leaf in the garden, but they left other things undone — such as living in truth and love (Matthew 23:23).

On the other side of the issue stand those who believe the tithe is a legalism meant only for the Jew. Therefore, they never establish any goals for tithing or sharing. They give, but on a hit and miss basis. They also are wrong. It is necessary to understand God's attitude in this area.

When God gave the law of tithing, the law didn't make the Jews tithe, it showed them where they fell short of what God expected. For a Christian seeking God's will, those principles point the way to peace, happiness and prosperity.

Next week we will look into some questions about sharing. As, how much is the tithe? Is it applicable to the Christian? Why did the Jews tithe? Why is money so important to God that He commands a testimony from it? The answers are important, and save us from falling into the trap of folklore around us. As you read this space now, and in the weeks ahead, open your mind to the Holy Spirit. Assess what you read on the basis of what God says, without any preconceived bias.
