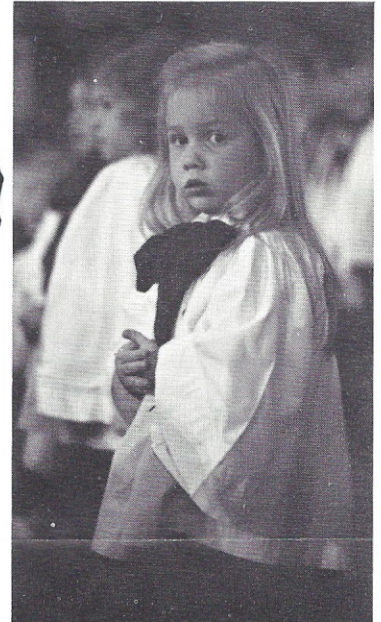

Challenger Award Banquet Follow-Up

The seventeenth Challenger Award Football Banquet, sponsored annually by the First Baptist Church, brought together seventeen hundred young people in December, 1985, representing twenty-four high schools in Northwest Florida and South Alabama.

The Challenger Banquet is staged yearly to honor the athlete, chosen by his teammates, deemed most Christlike both on and off the playing field. The stated purpose of the occasion is to recognize the outstanding Christian athlete from each participating high school and to present Jesus Christ to each person present.

The Fellowship of Christian Athletes handles all the follow-up from the banquet. This past year there were 130 responses from individuals who indicated a desire to know more about becoming a Christian. (Each person had a response card placed by his dinner plate). Every one of those who responded has received a personal Bible study designed to help him in his Christian growth. In addition, a year-long process has begun to get those students involved in a local church. Approximately 100 of the 130 indicated that they did not belong to a church.
