FROM THE UNITED STATES TO ECUADOR

David, Melissa, Kara and Blake

WHERE THEY'VE BEEN . . . 1973 David and Melissa were married while attending Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary where they both were studying for their degrees in Religious Education. Kara was born in 1974 and Blake in 1976. From 1975 to 1983 the family lived in Cleveland, Ohio; Nashville, Tennessee; Boutte, Louisiana; New Orleans, Louisiana, and Jefferson City, Missouri.

WHERE THEY ARE NOW . . . September, 1983, the Chisms came to First Baptist Church, Pensacola, where David has served as Minister of Education. During this time David and Melissa worked in Ecuador for two weeks during the summer in cooperation with Southern Baptist Partnership Evangelism teams. It was upon their

return that the call they had been hearing for some time from the Lord to become full-time missionaries was confirmed in their minds and hearts and the lengthy procedure was begun to apply for acceptance by the Foreign Mission Board. Over a period of many months mountains of paper work had to be prepared; life histories had to be written; medical records pulled together; questionnaires filled out; and several interviews by Foreign Mission Board personnel, and on and on . . . until the day the Board called to say, "Your acceptance is final."

WHERE THEY'RE GOING . . . April 11, 1986, David and Melissa will participate in formal appointment ceremonies in Denver, Colorado. June 16, 1986, David, Melissa, Kara and Blake go to Rockville, Virginia, for an eight-weeks orientation and training session. Then, in August they leave for Costa Rica, where they will spend one year in language school before they go in August of 1987 to the country to which they have been appointed to serve as foreign missionaries — ECUADOR.

Their first furlough back to the States? August, 1989 - June, 1990. Where will they live while they're on furlough? The First Baptist Church missionary house on Scenic Highway!

The love we are talking about here is not an emotion, based on the attractiveness and loveliness of other persons. Love and concern are learned feelings, attitudes that can be developed.

In a book titled *Three Kinds of Love*, Masumi Toyotome gives some clues on loving and carings.

1. The "IF" Kind of Love — This is love given if the one who is loved meets certain requirements. It's the most common kind of love. It is love with strings attached. A selfish love, it seeks to gain something in exchange.
2. The "BECAUSE" Kind of Love — The person is loved because of something he is, has, or does. "I Love You because you are beautiful, lovable, or make me feel good." There is insecurity in this kind of love. It exists only when we are "lovable."
3. The "IN SPITE" Kind of Love — No strings are attached and nothing is expected in return in this kind of love. The person does not have to deserve love or earn it; he is simply loved as he is with all the weaknesses and bad habits. This is the kind of love for which our hearts are desperately hungry. Christ offers "in spite of" love that many of us experience. Christ is the only source of this kind of love and He wants us to share this kind of love.
