NEW BUSINESS

SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION MESSENGER PROCEDURE

Because of the unusual amount of interest in the Southern Baptist Convention this year, the Committee on Committees and the Deacon Body have elected to ask church members to express their interest in attending the Convention by calling Margaret Shick, Bill Santo's secretary, 433-5631, on or before May 1.

Again, because of the interest, the decision has been made that only one member per household should be a voting messenger to the Convention.

The Committee on Committees will review the list of those willing to serve and recommend ten (10) nominees to the Deacon Body. The Deacons in turn will review and, if they think best, revise the list of nominees for submission to the church membership. Additional nominations may be made from the floor at the church business meeting. The congregation will then elect our ten (10) official messengers from these nominations.

Only registered messengers will be admitted into the Convention sessions. This decision has been made by the S.B.C. Committee on Order of Business because of limited space.
