GUEST PREACHER



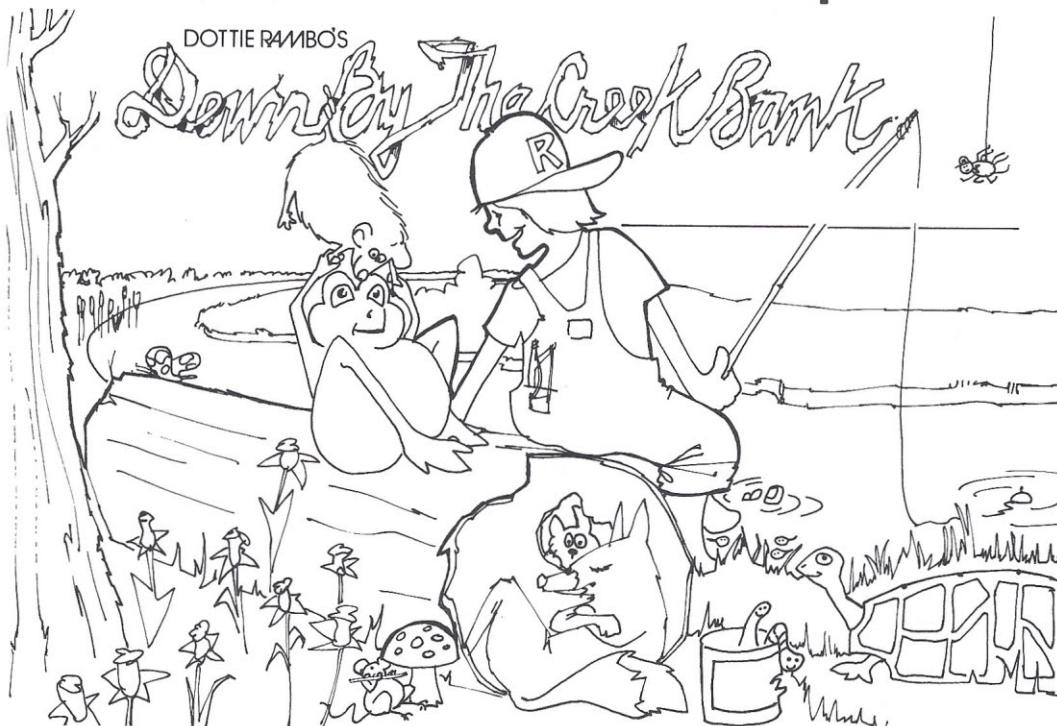
REV. GEORGE S. LOZUK

Reverend George S. Lozuk, associate to the area director for Western South America since April, 1985, will preach Sunday morning. Reverend Lozuk is stationed in Quito, Ecuador, where he acts as a liaison between missionaries in Western South America and the Foreign Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention. His various assignments since he was appointed in May, 1956, have involved him in general evangelism, radio and television, pastoral duties and teaching. Until 1982 Reverend Lozuk was stationed in Venezuela. Having lived and worked in the city where David, Melissa, Kara and Blake Chism will eventually live, Quito, Ecuador, after going through orientation and language studies, Reverend Lozuk will be able to bring to us during his message Sunday morning first-hand information about the work of foreign missions there.

Pray for Reverend Lozuk as he comes to speak to the church family and for the Chisms as they make final preparations for their departure from Pensacola to Rockville, Virginia, the second week of June.

SAMARITANS HANDS

Our culture tells us that power is domination, control over others. Power is "hoarding" and "holding on to," as if it could be measured. Power is playing God — having all the right answers, presenting an all-powerful, all-knowing image.

Jesus presents a different image of power: the towel and a basin of water. Seems silly, doesn't it? What kind of power is that? That's exactly what Jesus' disciples thought. As Jesus neared the end of His earthly life, His disciples believed He was waiting for just the right moment to assert His power and assume religious and political leadership. The disciples were sure Jesus was the right man to overthrow the Romans. After all, hadn't He walked on water, changed the water into wine, and made the blind see? What a great King he'd make! What power!

But at the Last Supper, with His motley crew of disciples gathered around, Jesus picked up a towel and a basin of water and started washing the feet of the disciples. They were stunned. This was mighty strange behavior for a King. Jesus wasn't just washing the dirt from their feet. He was washing away their crippling concepts of power. He was demonstrating power in the form of servanthood, power in the towel and basin of water.

What does the towel and water look like today? When Jesus returns, He's not going to check titles, bank accounts, or the height of our steeples. He's going to check towels. There's a towel out there with each of our names on it. To pick up that towel is to step with power into a hurting world. The real name for power is compassion. Christ is the divine manifestation of compassionate power. He didn't come to rule but to serve.

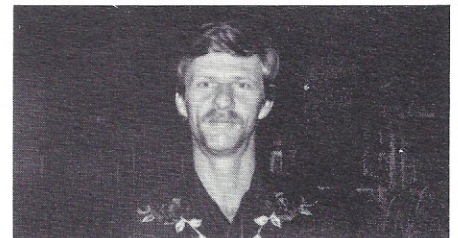
