## CHURCH CALLS REVEREND CECIL SEAGLE AS PASTOR

### Seagles to Begin Their Pensacola Ministry on September 7

By unanimous and enthusiastic vote on Sunday morning, August 17, the church invited Reverend Cecil Seagle to be its pastor. Reverend Seagle then gave his immediate response and announced that he will be here as pastor beginning September 7.

Reverend Seagle was born September 18, 1939, in Madison County, North Carolina. He attended elementary school in Drayton, South Carolina, and junior and senior high school in Spartanburg, South Carolina. Following graduation in 1957 he served three years (1957-1960) in the United States Air Force.

His wife, Peggie, is an accomplished pianist, choir member, and Sunday School teacher. She and Cecil are also the loving parents of two grown sons, Donald Alan and Mark Cecil.

Returning to Spartanburg in 1960, Cecil earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Wofford College in three years. He then went on to earn his Master of Divinity Degree from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in Wake Forest, North Carolina.

His former positions include several pastorates and a state denominational post. During his college and seminary days he pastored the Buckeye Forest Baptist Mission, Spartanburg, in 1961 and the Cannons Baptist Church in the same city from 1962-1966. From 1966-1969 he was pastor of the Pacolet Mills Baptist Church of Pacolet Mills, South Carolina, and served his longest tenure to date at the Mulberry Baptist Church of Charlotte, North Carolina, from 1970-1982.

From 1982 to 1984 he was Director of Evangelism for the Florida Baptist Convention. From there he was called to Westwood Hill Baptist Church, Virginia Beach, Virginia, where he has served well since October 28, 1984.

During the past five years some of his service has included being a member of the Committee on Boards, Commissions, and Standing Committees of the Southern Baptist Convention (1982), being a trustee for Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary (1979-1983), being a member of the Board of Directors of the **Biblical Recorder** in North Carolina (1979-1983), and being a speaker at the Florida Baptist Convention Pastors' Conference in 1983 and Florida Baptist Evangelism Conference in 1983 and 1985.

## FBC MISSIONARIES TO JAPAN

Pat and Al Ford will be commissioned in the morning service Sunday, August 24, prior to their departure to Japan where they will serve as Directors of Kyoto Friendship House until April, 1987. They will be working in this interim position while Dorothy and Wayne Maddox are on furlough here in Pensacola. Sharon Thompson, who was commissioned in last Sunday night's service, has already left for Kyoto where she will also be working with the Fords, serving as a volunteer missionary. Sharon has written a note of thanks to the "Church Family" for its "financial support, prayers and words of encouragement."




