The Seagle Say:

BUDGET RECEIPTS . . .

January 1 through September 30 are about \$115,000 behind budget needs. That's the bad news. The good news is that we are operating in the black because of the excellent management of *Bill Santo* and *Charlotte Martin*.

A DEFICIT . . .

of any amount is not acceptable. There are several reasons for such a bold statement —

- 1. A deficit seldom reflects a financial problem. It's much more complicated than that.
- 2. A deficit usually reflects:
 - a). a significant spiritual problem in that the family of faith has not been challenged and taught the Biblical principles of good management (stewardship) - or -
 - b). they have been *taught* but the concept was not *caught* - or -
 - c). the family of faith is divided and because of division does not willingly give as our Lord requires - or -
 - d). the *vision* for reaching a *lost* and *unchurched* world has not been shared or received - or -
 - e). The commitment level to over-subscribe the financial needs isn't strong enough to see us achieve what we set out to do!

RECENT WEEKS . . .

suggest to me a strong willingness to say YES to the challenge before us. I am asking you to join me in eliminating this deficit before December 31, 1986.

YOU HAVE . . .

a right to know of my personal commitment.

- 1. I believe in "storehouse giving" as one of the essentials. The believer will begin at the tithe and progress to "as the Lord has prospered" you;
- 2. I believe in an all-encompassing, fully-funded, ministry-action budget — thus limiting the need for numerous extra designated appeals;
- 3. I believe in you! Peggie, Mark and I will give generously and sacrificially to this church through its budget — thus meeting world needs.

Coming soon is a great MAKE-UP DAY. My family and I will participate. World needs demand it. Local missions require it. Ministry needs request it.

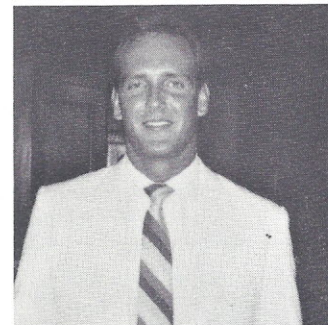
