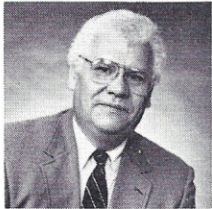

PHILOSOPHY . . .

I operate basically out of two concepts.

- 1. The millions of dollars spent on current facilities requires us to be good stewards of those buildings. They must be properly maintained. Walls must be painted. Carpet must be replaced. Lighting must be upgraded. I do not worship buildings, but I do respect them because they house the Family of God. Because this is the "Church House," I will constantly emphasize the need to keep it in top repair. For instance:
 - the grounds should be the most beautifully-kept in this city;
 - the facilities must be immaculately clean;
 - the worn furniture must be replaced;
 - the . . . well, I'm certain you get the picture. To accomplish this will require ALL of us to assist. Pick up all paper and place all trash in receptacles. Let's use but never abuse the "Church House."

- 2. We must diligently plan for the future. I function best when I know where I'm going. A carefully-laid-out plan is essential.

THAT'S EXACTLY . . .

what the two committees will do for us. One will bring a solid plan to us for upgrading our facilities. The other will study every area of ministry and will lay a well-designed plan to the year 2000.

PRAYER . . .

for both groups is vital. Cooperation with both groups is essential. Willingness to do is necessary.

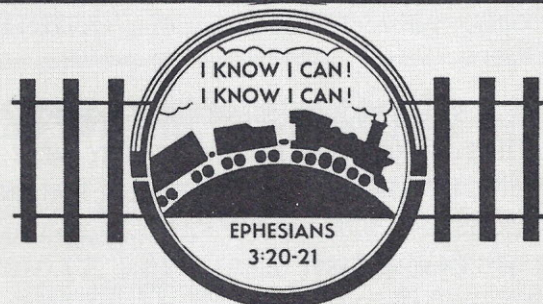
NOVEMBER 16

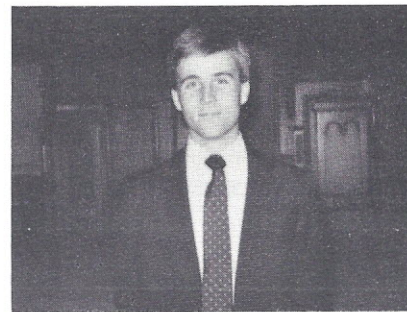
