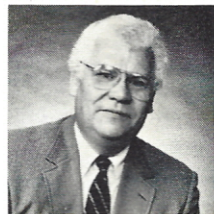

CATCH THE VISION!

Reasons For Using Your Personalized, Numbered, Church Contribution Envelopes

- I. Your envelopes are provided through the Church Budget and are mailed directly to your home, for your convenience, every other month.
- II. Internal Revenue Service will no longer accept as proof of contribution, your cancelled check. Contributions must be shown on your Stewardship Record provided by the church.
- III. When using a "Mark-Out" envelope from the church pew rack, or dropping a check in the offering plate, we are sometimes faced with these problems:
 1. The name on the check and the name on our Master File may not be the same.
 2. Sometimes the counting committee cannot read the name written on the "Mark-Out" envelopes. When cash is given there is no way to give the donor credit for the gift.
 3. We may have more than one person by the same name on our Master File.

Using your Church Envelopes will be a sure way of receiving credit for all your contributions to your church.

If any member of your family is not receiving envelopes, please let Joyce Cerreto in the Church Office know. Also, if anyone is receiving envelopes and they are no longer at that address, please let us know.

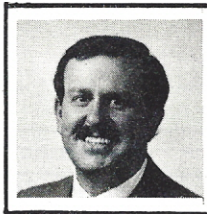

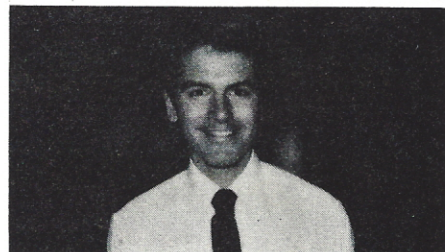

FBC PRAYER MINISTRY

"And Samuel said, Gather all Israel to Mizpeh, and I WILL PRAY FOR YOU unto the Lord." (1 Samuel 7:5)

How many times do we tell friends, lost ones, fellow believers, relatives, "I will pray for you"? How often do we unashamedly ask others to pray for us?

In 1 Samuel 7 we see an example of Samuel praying for help for the Israelites in their struggle with the pagan Philistines. The Israelites themselves had engaged in pagan worship, and Samuel, in his address to them said, "If you do return unto the Lord with all your hearts, then put away the pagan idols, and prepare your hearts unto the Lord, and serve Him only: and He will deliver you out of the hand of the Philistines." (v. 3)

In verse 7 we see them fasting and confessing. In verses 10 and 11 we read of the Lord's providence. In verse 12 we find gratitude expressed to the Lord.

As we pray and ask for the prayers of others, let's not forget this example of God's provision and man's ensuing gratitude in 1 Samuel 7.
