FBC PRAYER MINISTRY

"And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed." (Mark 1:35)

If we read the preceding 34 verses in Mark 1, we see that this was a very busy time in Jesus's earthly ministry. Verse 33 indicates He was still working as "the sun did set."

Oftentimes we in the 20th century think we have cornered the market on heavy schedules; however, as we read of Jesus's long days and demanding timetable we see that we are not alone. In the focal passage we see what Jesus did though as He faced another busy day. He did not just "hope" everything turned out right; He devoted the early morning hours in prayer to His Father, seeking guidance and strength for each day.

Like Jesus, we find our lives filled with opportunities for service and pressed by great needs. In such times, however, we should not yield to the temptation to give less time to prayer and study.

Jesus said, "As my Father hath taught me, I speak. . . ." (John 8:28). That same assurance can be ours.
