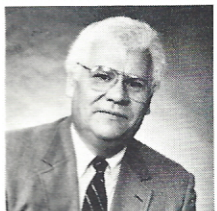

means various things to various people. To most of us it means the thing that occurs at the close of each worship service.

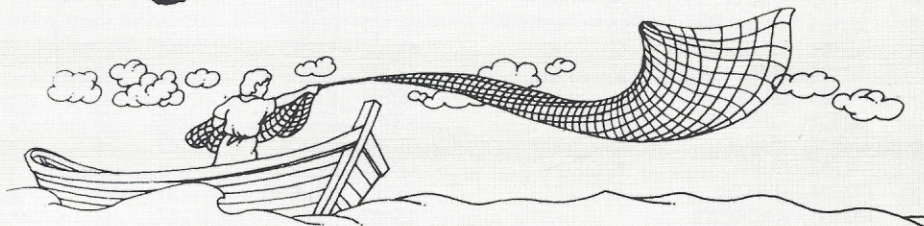

OUR FAMILY PRAYING
