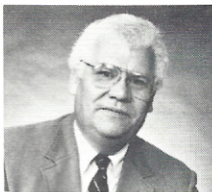
## The Seagle Say:

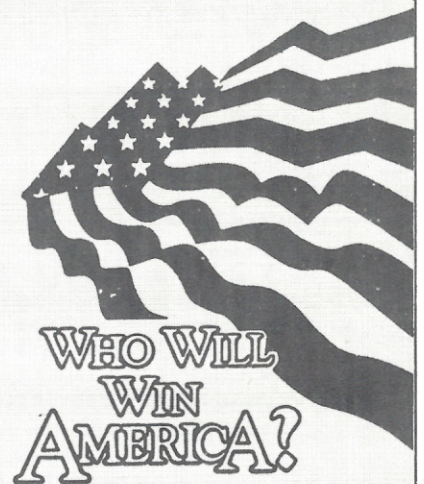

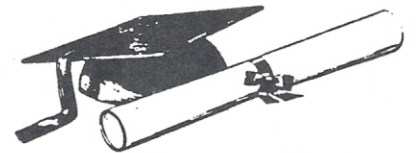
