FINANCES . . .



JAPAN

The following article appeared in the April, 1987, issue of *Commission Magazine*. Because of our church's participation with the Urawa Baptist Church in Japan perhaps this will enlighten those who read it and make all of us more aware of our need to pray for the Japan Mission trip in the Fall.

SHARING A DREAM

Following services at Christ's Church in Fujimi (a mission of one of the larger Baptist churches in Tokyo), pastor Akehi asked if we could go with him "downtown." He meant Fujimi City, one of the many districts (population 180,000) contained within Tokyo proper.

(We're) not always sure of what he will lead us into. Sometimes we give out handbills. (We enjoy that; giving out handbills brought a woman to our English Bible class who had never been in a church. Now she comes every week.) But though everyone else left carrying handbills, the pastor gave us none.

We walked with him to the train station and took the elevator to the 14th floor in the apartment building above the station. There, spread before us, was Fujimi City. "I wanted you to see that there is some open space here, some space that we could have another church," the pastor said.

I nearly bit my lip. Our little mission is squashed into a space not larger than the post office in a very small town back home. Our sanctuary is not as large as the den in most American homes. Behind the church we have one classroom — actually a converted storage building.

But the pastor was not complaining. He was dreaming and sharing his dream with us. "I come up here every week and pray as I look down upon Fujimi City," he said. "I pray that God will help us as we try to win this city to Christ."

"I know we don't have much to offer," he said, his voice cracking with emotion, tears welling up in his eyes, "but we don't need much when we have Jesus, do we?"



Messengers to Southern Baptist Convention June 16 - 18, St. Louis, Missouri

The following procedure will be used in electing Messengers to the Southern Baptist Convention:

- 1. First-come, first-serve basis — i.e., those who wish to be Messengers call the church office and request their names be posted. Name, date and time of call will be listed.
- 2. If those who desire to represent First Baptist Church Pensacola outnumber the slots available for Messenger representation the Committee on Committees will be asked to select those who will represent FBC.
- 3. A record will be kept of those elected to serve that year and the list will influence the next year's selection process. That is, those elected messengers in 1987 would not be given preferential treatment for the following year, 1988, allowing a new representative group to attend as Messengers.

OUR FAMILY PRAYING
