The Seagle Say:

LET'S TAKE A TEST . . .

today! True or false:

— 1. "If the church was doing its job no other groups would need to exist for ministry."

— 2. "Thousands will never darken the door of the church and are totally unresponsive to visitation." How do you respond to those two oft-quoted observations?

THE TRUTH IS . . .

truth lies somewhere in the middle of the "true - false" choice.

It is true, the church has failed to respond to some areas of individual concern. Individuals sharing those kinds of personal concerns have generally been uninvolved in on-going ministries. For a variety of reasons they "open fire" on the obvious failure of the church. The truth is, no one wants to see: 3900 foreign missionaries who are in food distribution, agriculture, music, education, field evangelism, medicine that are in every way an extension of First Baptist Church, Pensacola's life, or — 3800 home missionaries planting mission churches, day cares, food distribution, inner-city soup kitchens, ethnic or language missions, field evangelism, etc. — or the myriad associational and state convention work that involves significant commitment to Florida. The truth is para-church groups do exist — not because the church has failed but because someone decided to go outside the church to do ministry. That's O.K. — but don't blame the church for their choice.

It is true some will not "darken the door" of the church and are not responsive to "visitation." Dear friends, the tragedy of such observation is that the pattern of touching folks' lives is not bound to "visitation" only. The observation is true only to the degree of our unwillingness to build bridges of concern to those who need Christ.

A SOLUTION . . .

seems obvious to me.

— 1. We must investigate what's right as well as what's wrong with the church before making generalized charges.

— 2. We must stop blaming the "church" for lack of concern for the lost and blame ourselves. We — all of the we's — are church!

— 3. People do respond to the Gospel and will "darken" church doors when we build bridges of concern to them and personally bring them to worship and celebration.

Am I oblivious to weakness and failures of the church? Of course not! I'm for fixing, not lambasting the bride of Christ. If we do, a world like ours will be better for it.


- 1) Rehearsal begins at 5:00 P.M.; and




