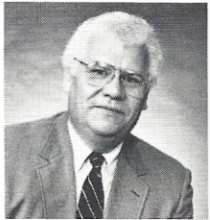

First Baptist has launched a ministry to Pensacola by way of television.

— Dr. D. James Kennedy, great preacher and pastor of Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church near Ft. Lauderdale — and on I could go.

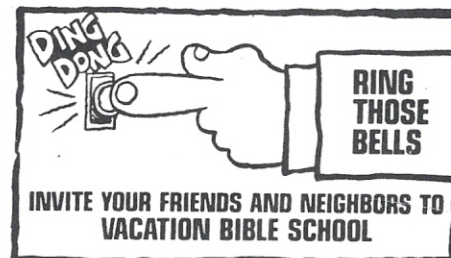

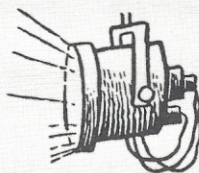
