Urawa Church Makes Preparation

"Enlarge the place of your tent; stretch out the curtains of your dwellings, spare not; lengthen your cords, and strengthen your pegs. For you will spread abroad to the right and to the left, and your descendants will possess nations, and they will resettle the desolate cities." (Isaiah 54:2-3).

"For we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake." (2 Cor. 4-5).

These verses from Isaiah and 2 Corinthians have been chosen by the Urawa Baptist Church as the theme for the partnership mission effort with Pensacola First Baptist Church. For many months this small congregation has been hard at work in preparation for the fall undertaking.

Members of First Baptist Church will be most appreciative to know that pictures and names of all team members have been posted in each Sunday School room of the Urawa Church so that members may learn to recognize them and be encouraged to pray for each one by name. Special prayer meetings are being held, and the Japanese have been asked for our prayer requests so that they may be praying for our church, as they ask us to pray for them.

A local school teacher has been in process of translating into Japanese *On the Bay — On the Hill*, so that their people may become familiar with the history of our church and appreciate its heritage as we do.

Homes have been selected for nightly Bible studies, opportunities for visiting local schools and universities have been planned, and tremendous outreach efforts are being made in all directions as they seek to enlarge their vision and preach Christ to their families, neighbors, and the city at large.
