The Seagle Say:

THE DEATH . . .

of a dream is an awesomely awful thing to see. It comes slowly, painfully — frequently without much warning. Those who dreamed, planned, and worked on



the original dream often lapse into nostalgic conversations that remember how it used to be! Those who never shared the dream, never enjoyed formulating the dream are left in a state of dis-ease —

which is within itself a terribly infectious disease.

EVERY CHURCH . . .

without exception, will see its dream mature and that dream will either die or be redreamed. Unless something is done quickly — the organization will begin to stagnate, plateau, decline and die.

RE-DREAMING . . .

the dream is not optional nor is it without problem. Those in a state of nostalgic remembering will sing a marvelous song titled "We Shall Not Be Moved!" They remember how it was when "Pastor Fling Diddle" was pastor. Others, frightened by what they perceive as creeping paralysis

and eventual death, boomerang to some exotic style of worship or adopt some "cure-all" program that's "avant-garde," creative and "yuppie" oriented.

Soon a polarization comes and the entire church is swallowed in controversy that polarizes people into camps of resistance. The camps soon see a leader/spokesman emerge as the conflicts heats. From there, decline and death instead of healing, wholeness and dream pops to the surface.

IS THERE . . .

an escape, a way out? The answer is absolutely yes! The problem with the answer is that it calls the church back to priority and dream.

The problem is that His dream requires persistent, "sweaty," hard work. The dream demands we establish forever the priority of enlisting, winning, sharing Christ with unsaved and unchurched people. The dream must once again struggle with the how 'til we've re-dreamed it — then recommitted ourselves to it.

We're re-dreaming it at Pensacola First. I'm not certain at this point about commitment to His dream and our mandate. The signs look promising. Those signs are not, however, clear. Help me clarify our communication as well as our commitment.
