\$125,000 ***Gift For*** ***Television Equipment Received***

A cash gift in the amount of \$125,000 has been received from a donor who wishes to remain anonymous. The gift is designated for purchase of much-needed television equipment. After the conversation a gift was made, no strings attached, but firmly designated for the purchase of much-needed new equipment.

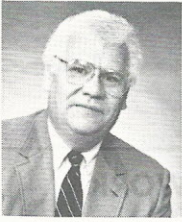
