CREDIBILITY . . .

is not optional for those who willingly, openly follow Jesus Christ. The truth is — the follower's credibility is both tarnished and questioned. That grieves me to the deepest levels of my life. The reality of it all crystallized in a Customs line in Miami a few weeks ago.



PERU . . .

Peruvian pastors and people as well as Southern Baptist missionaries had been a part of the four-person team's life for a full week. Tired from a long week of exciting venture and weary from an all-night flight, I was jolted by the response of a tough-minded Customs agent when told the group had their pastor with them. The Customs agent, looking at me, said — "Man, that don't count for much anymore, does it?"

We all laughed! He smiled. I weakly walked on to the Eastern counter to check in luggage.

A CUSTOMS AGENT . . .

in Miami clearly brought into focus the terrible dilemma of the family of faith in today's climate.

Credibility is suspect if not fully destroyed. The seriousness of the dilemma is not to be measured by what's being felt inside the family of faith, but how we are perceived outside the family of faith. If my cynical agent friend is an example — we're in a lot of trouble.

THE TRUTH . . .

is we — all of us who name the name of Christ — are responsible. We're responsible for additional erosion or additional stability.

The climate of today's world requires this pastor to "be an example of the believer." Friend — I've never been more aware of the cynicism. I must tell you, the depth of cynicism requires a response of equal depth.

Let it be said that FBC is *for real* because of our commitment to mirror the Christ Whom we love and serve.
