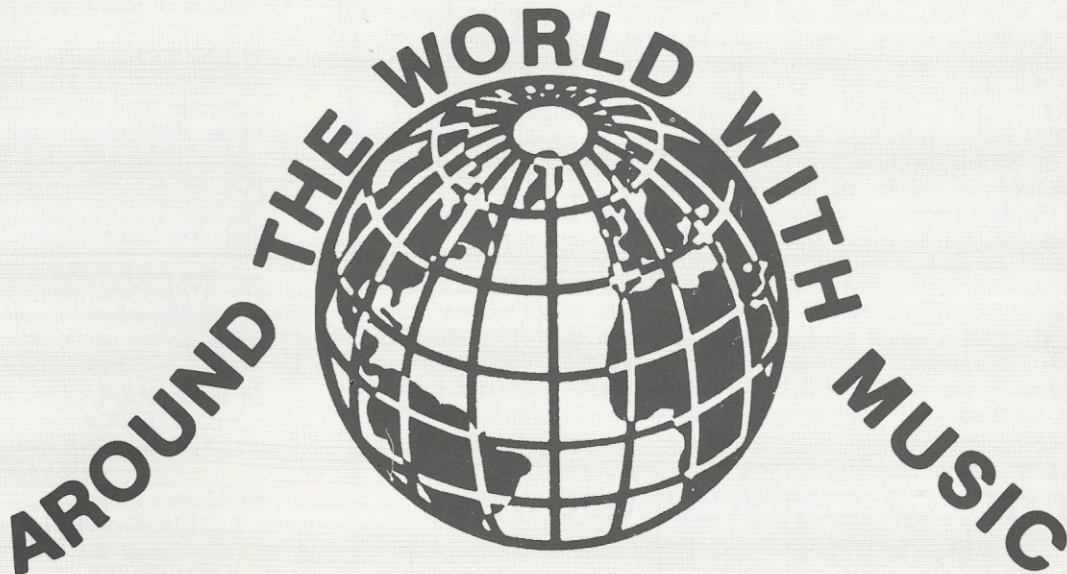

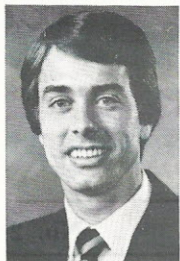

With the crowded schedules brought about by T-ball, baseball, softball, soccer, etc., it really becomes a challenge to maintain our Children's choirs; however, thanks to many parents who went that "second mile," over 100 children have remained faithful. THE SANCTUARY CHOIR'S CHILD WATCH MINISTRY BEGINS IN JUNE! This is a service made possible by the folks who have said *count on me* to sit with children of choir members during the morning worship hour. It will benefit not only those present choir members who have children too old for the nursery, yet too young to sit alone . . . but, hopefully, it will open the door for many prospective choir members to come ahead and join the ranks of the singing! CHAPEL CHOIR FACES THE FINAL WEEKS OF TOUR PREPARATIONS. These 36 youth who have committed to going on TOUR '88 have really begun to *bear down* on their tour music. Only three short weeks remain, during which we must finish learning and memorizing our concert. The program this year includes five sections, three by the choir, one by Surrender, and one by our Chapel Bells. INSTITUTE FOR CHRISTIAN GROWTH SUMMER CLASSES

"WITNESSMASTERS" — Mark York — Room S-108

SURVIVAL KIT FOR LEADERS — Beth Gowing — Room S-107

This course prepares its participants to help new Christians work through an eleven-week beginning disciple experience. Those who complete this study will have opportunity to help new Christians begin their new lives in Christ on a solid base. The study will use the Southern Baptist book *Survival Kit for New Christians* as the text.

INTERCESSORY PRAYER - DOES IT REALLY WORK? — Joan Peterson — Room S-106

This class will include 1) a slide program focusing on the personal way God uses Christians as a result of prayer, 2) a focus on the ministries at FBC and how God is reaching people through them, 3) a session on Peru will seek God's wisdom and direction in this partnership venture, and 4) the final session will highlight Urawa Baptist Church in Japan and specific plans for their visit to FBC next year.

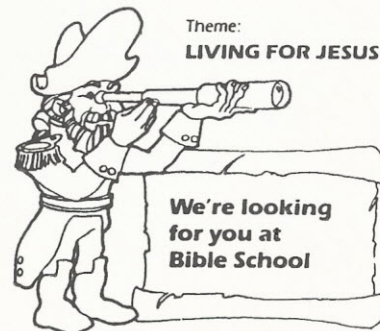

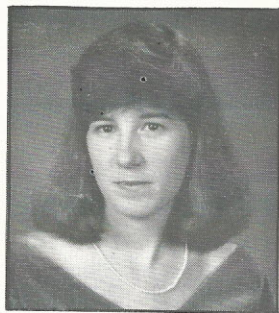

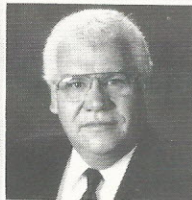

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CHURCH CORPORATION

All members of the church congregation are also automatically members of the church corporation, First Baptist Church of Pensacola, Inc., chartered as a non-profit corporation under the laws of Florida. Originally, the function of the corporation has been limited to holding legal title to all of the church real estate and executing all contracts, mortgages, deeds, and other legal instruments relating to real estate. Under revised bylaws adopted in 1982, the corporation was also assigned the responsibility of administering and investing funds contributed to the church by special gift or bequest and other reserve funds. To oversee the investment of all of these funds, and to encourage additional gifts and bequests, the bylaws directed that a Foundation Committee be established. 1983 was the first full year in which the corporation and its Foundation Committee have had these additional responsibilities.

We are pleased to submit this report identifying the funds under administration with their fund and interest balances at December 31, 1987. The funds are grouped in accordance with the purposes for which they were given.

MISSION FUNDS

1. Income distributed annually 2/3 to Lottie Moon Offering, 1/3 to Annie Armstrong Offering. Donated by an anonymous couple. Fund balance, \$160,500.00; interest earned ('87) \$10,500.00 (interest distributed for the designated purposes).
2. Income distributed annually 1/4 to Home Missions, 1/4 to State Missions, 1/2 to Foreign Missions. Donated by Mrs. Claudia C. McCurley. Fund balance, \$1,419.78; interest earned ('87) \$156.16 (interest distributed for designated purposes).

FUNDS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE OR THEIR ACTIVITIES

3. Interest to be used to assist girls in attending camp. Donated by Harvey Hedrick Missionary Group (Nancy E. Allen Fund). Recipients to be selected by the Mission Action Chairman of WMU in consultation with church staff. Fund balance, \$1,756.73, interest earned ('87) \$140.44, available funds \$756.73.
4. Income to be used to assist young people in attending Foreign Mission Week at Ridgcrest. Income not so used in any year may be added to Lottie Moon Offering. Donated by Miss Annie (Nan) Beggs in memory of her father, Judge E.D. Beggs (1861-1940). Fund balance, \$5,000.00; interest earned ('87) \$322.97; available funds \$322.97.
5. The Dolly McGowin Memorial Fund donated by her mother, Mrs. E.F. Dunbar, the income to be used to foster youth work in the church. Fund balance \$7,336.02, interest earned ('87) \$428.28; available funds \$1,336.02.
6. College Scholarship Fund consisting of the gift of \$10,000.00 from Mr. and Mrs. Sandy Sansing, a gift in memory of Dr. H.T. Dukes of \$940.00, and an anonymous gift of stock sold with proceeds of \$21,634.90. Income is to be used for students attending Pensacola Junior College, University of West Florida, or other educational institutions, in that order of priority in the allocation of funds. A Scholarship Fund Committee has been established by the church to make scholarship awards from available income. Fund balance, \$33,631.23; interest earned ('87) \$1,783.20; available funds \$1,056.33. There were 6 students awarded scholarships in 1987.
7. A memorial gift was received from the Lon Roberts family in the amount of \$1,000.00. Memorial gifts from others totaling \$743.50 were combined with the original gift. The income is to be used to send youths to camp. Fund balance \$1,936.24, interest earned ('87) \$107.85; available funds - \$192.74.

FUNDS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF NEW CHAPEL

8. A gift in 1976 from the Estate of Earl R. Gaston of approximately \$22,000.00 was the start of this fund to be used to construct a chapel. Interest and other gifts have increased this fund balance to \$148,622.59; interest earned ('87) \$8,499.10
9. Bequest under will of Mrs. Hazel Watson Coleman to be used in establishing or assisting a church or mission in an inadequately church area or, if impracticable, then in construction or furnishing a new chapel. The fund remains intact. Fund balance \$10,212.79; interest earned ('87) \$494.25.
10. An anonymous member gave in June 1987 a real estate mortgage in the amount of \$5,878. Monthly payments of \$100 (principal and interest) go to this fund. If paid off "on schedule" this will produce \$7,385 over a period of approximately 6 years.

GENERAL RESERVE FUND

11. This fund originated with a bequest of \$22,959.99 under the will of Mrs. Jan P. Ainslie, received in December, 1983, with no use or purpose specified. This fund will be kept invested and the income accumulated until the specific use of income or principal is authorized by the church. Fund balance \$37,966.32; interest earned ('87) \$2,066.97.
12. Proceeds from the sale of the Georgia Parker homeplace of \$27,500.00 were received in 1984. Purchases of several parcels of property near the church totaling \$19,909.45 were made from 1985 to 1987 from this account with approval of the church. Fund balance \$14,455.97; interest earned ('87) \$990.86.
13. In 1979 Carrie Lee left to the church a total of \$9,272.00 in her will. Soon after the monies were received, the church faced expenses for sanctuary repairs that were not funded. This fund has been used through the years for this and other miscellaneous expenses. Fund balance \$4,604.37; interest earned ('87) \$248.71.

MEMORIAL GIFT PROGRAM

The Foundation Committee inaugurated in the last half of 1983 a plan to receive gifts made to the church in memory of deceased persons and also to honor living persons. A very attractive "Book of Remembrance" is in the church vestibule under glass. The name of each person honored by a gift to this fund, whether living or deceased, will be recorded in this "Book of Remembrance". The names of the donors will be published in *The First Baptist Builder* and kept on record in the church office. Attractive acknowledgement cards are sent to each donor and an announcement of the gift is sent to the bereaved family or to the honored living person.

14. Foundation Memorial Fund: Memorial gifts designated for this Fund under the program described above, as well as all undesignated memorial gifts, will be accumulated in this fund and permanently invested. The principal will be held inviolate. The income, upon approving vote of the congregation specifying as unanticipated emergency need other than budgeted items, current expenses, previously incurred obligations and the like, may be applied to such need. Unexpended income will be accumulated. Fund balance \$15,880.43; interest earned ('87) \$938.07

Gifts may be for designated purposes such as the Foundation Memorial Fund, the library, the building fund, Missions offerings, or as additions to any of the funds listed above. Undesignated memorial gifts are placed in the Foundation Memorial Fund for permanent investment.

SPECIAL PURPOSE FUNDS

15. Contributions from several members of the Board of Directors and of the Foundation Committee to cover general expenses of the Corporation. Balance on hand is \$193.06.
16. Gifts totaling \$9,100.00 from a church family designated toward the purchase of vehicles for the use of the church. A purchase of \$3,759.40 was made in 1987. Balance on hand is \$6,022.70.
17. A gift of \$1,000.00 given specifying that sanctuary bibles be purchased. This gift has been disbursed by the purchase of these bibles.

REAL ESTATE HELD IN TRUST

18. A parcel of real estate not presently being used for any church purpose was approved for sale by members of the corporation at the annual meeting on January 29, 1984.
This parcel is approximately 4.1 acres on University Parkway, near the University of West Florida, acquired in about 1968, at a cost of \$28,000.00 (less gifts of several thousand dollars subsequently made to the church by the seller), and presently appraised at \$72,500.00. It is thought that a consensus should be sought from the Mission Committee of the Church, the Board of Directors of the Corporation and the Fellowship of Deacons for a recommendation to the church membership on how the proceeds when due property is sold should be used or invested, the proceeds to be temporarily invested pending such action.
19. Ray and Marion Edwards gave to the Church Lots 7 and 8, Block 122, Maxent Tract in December, 1986. This property has been appraised at \$4,500.00 and is presently being offered for sale. Use not designated.

A WORD OF APPRECIATION

The Board of Directors of the Corporation and the members of the Foundation Committee greatly appreciate the gifts and bequests detailed in this report, and the wonderful acceptance of the church membership of the Memorial Gift program. We encourage all church members who are in a position to do so to put their financial affairs in order so as to make gifts during their lifetime and at death to bequest, through a will out of their material blessings, gifts to demonstrate their love for our Heavenly Father and their desire to promote the establishment of His Kingdom. Additions may be made to any of these established funds or for other designated purposes approved by the church.
