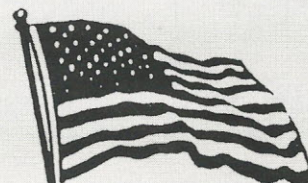
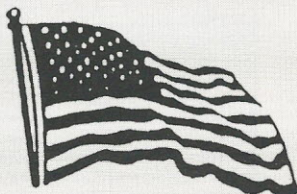

Growing Deep In The Christian Life

by Charles Swindoll.

Multonomah Press, c1986.

An excellent choice, or a subtle suggestion, for anyone seeking, or needing, to strengthen the doctrinal foundations of evangelical faith is this latest offering of Charles Swindoll and his multi-faceted ministry. Subtitled *Returning To Our Roots*, Swindoll's book clarifies for what has been termed a "cut-flower" generation the strong, no-qualifying basics necessary for sound doctrine. Swindoll's creative, illustrative writing style, combined with his insightful, often humorous, grasp of persons-in-the-pew needs, speaks richly to both laymen, his stated intention, as well as the scholar. 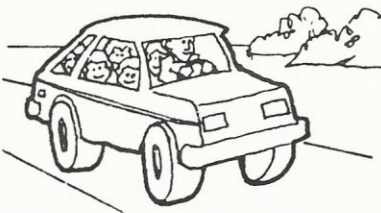

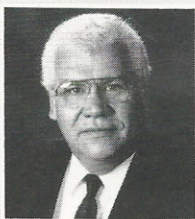

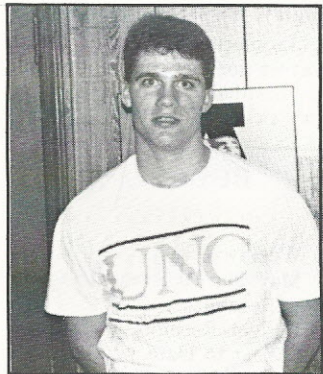
