PERU PARTNERSHIP TAKES SHAPE

With unanimous church approval on Sunday night, June 5, First Baptist Church has entered into a partnership of ministry with Baptists in Trujillo, Peru. Missionary Rodolph Dixon will be coordinating the relationship as he oversees the work of fourteen churches in the Trujillo area.

The visit of four FBC members to Trujillo in March served to confirm the Foreign Mission Board's designation of that area as a place where God can use us in many ways over the next five to six years. The warm acceptance of our ambassadors emphasized the understanding that all of us are brothers and sisters in Christ, seeking to expand His kingdom in cooperative fashion.

Projects will be planned so as to preserve the credibility of the work of Southern Baptists in Peru and the Peru Baptist Convention. Stress will be placed on working alongside Peruvian Christians in their ministries and on providing assistance in areas where they sense the needs.

Reaching the lost will be the over-riding emphasis. Avenues of assistance may include such ministries as evangelism, training of church leadership, music, construction, medical and dental care, healthcare education, and management skills.

Prayer is the most important ministry involved in this partnership. Please begin now to pray for the churches in Trujillo and for the work that will be accomplished with them. Pray for Rodolph Dixon as he guides local pastors and church leadership in planning their work.

Andy White, Jenna Young, and Martha Trotter are available to share information and slides on Peru with any department, class, or group interested in learning more about SBC mission work in Trujillo. Further information on the partnership and on the first project will be forthcoming in BUILDER articles over the next several weeks.

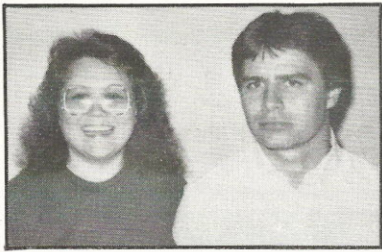

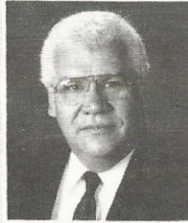

The Seagle Say:

PASTORAL CARE . . .

is not an option for a group who call themselves "Church." The truth is, pastoral care involves far more than the pastor. Allow me to state the obvious — one person has no possibility of meeting all the needs of a large congregation. That's obvious. You knew that already. With that in mind — let me share a plan and process — then make a request.



THE PLAN . . .

is simple. A pastoral care program must involve:

- 1. the pastor;
- 2. the ministerial staff;
- 3. the deacon team;
- 4. Sunday School teachers;
- 5. and various caring groups such as Samaritans Hands; deacon mission action and prayer support groups.

The plan includes:

- 1. daily hospital visitation by the pastor and staff, supplemented by deacons

and Sunday School teachers;

- 2. regular homebound visitation by the pastor and staff. The visitation assignment is made to each of us. Gary Garland is currently visiting our homebound folk.

- 3. quick response by pastor and staff to crisis situations;

- 4. counseling that allows referral to clinicians as needs arise.

I'm sharing this in order for each of you and all of you to know my commitment and our entire staff's commitment to excellent care.

MY REQUEST . . .

- 1. Call the church office and share full information about hospitalization, deaths or needs.

- 2. Keep us posted on those you know who are undergoing difficult times.

- 3. A member of the pastoral team will respond to the need.

Building family requires patience, trust and full information. Keep us informed. Our heart is in the right place!
