



## PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATING DEACONS 1988

The committee for the Nomination of Deacons requests that every member of the church suggest men who should be considered by the committee for nomination as deacons. You may suggest as many as you think qualify.

These suggestions must reach the committee before Wednesday, July 13. They may be given to any members of the committee, mailed to the church office in care of the committee or dropped in the offering plate. Suggestions are to be submitted only by members of the First Baptist Church, and therefore must be signed to be accepted.

Your committee, selected for the purpose of recommending to the church the best qualified persons, requests that you read the Scripture passages below and suggest the names of as many men as you believe to be qualified to serve as deacons. According to the policy of the church, inactive deacons will not be placed on the ballot unless suggested by one or more members of the church.

## SELECTION OF FIRST DEACONS

"And in those days, when the number of disciples was multiplied, there arose a murmuring of the Grecians against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily ministrations. Then the twelve called the multitude of the disciples unto them, and said, 'It is not reason that we should leave the word of God, and serve tables. Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business. But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word.' " (Acts 6:1-4, KJV)

## THE CHARACTER AND QUALIFICATIONS OF ALL DEACONS

"Likewise must the deacons be grave, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre; Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience. And let these also first be proved; then let them use the office of a deacon, being found blameless. Even so must their wives be grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things. Let the deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. For they that have used the office of a deacon well purchase to themselves a good degree, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus." (1 Timothy 3:8-13, KJV)

We urge you to be much in prayer that we as a church may know God's will in this all-important task.

The vote by the church membership on the nominations recommended by the committee will be announced later.

### PERU PARTNERSHIP

The Peru Baptist Mission, the organization of all Southern Baptist missionaries in Peru, will hold its annual meeting in Lima July 3-13.

Missionaries gather to plan and budget their work for the next year, to pray, and to share fellowship. They will be working under heavy constraints at this meeting because of budget cut-backs. With the shortfall of the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for Foreign Missions and lower Cooperative Program receipts, the Foreign Missions Board has asked all missions to submit budgets 12 per cent below present operating funds.

Please be much in prayer for our missionary personnel as they make decisions on priorities and the best use of available monies. Pray that the credibility of Southern Baptist work in reaching people for Christ will not suffer as a result of these cut-backs.

Near the end of the meeting, Hayward Armstrong will assume his new responsibilities as the Administrative Chairman of the Peru Mission. Pray for Hayward and his family. Ask God to give him the wisdom, flexibility, and strength to fulfill all the demands which he will face in pioneering this newly-created position. Pray for Sherra, Rachel, and Taylor as they adjust to new home, new schools, new friends, new work.

Thank God for guiding Pensacola FBC into partnership with Baptist churches in Trujillo. Pray that the Mission will be encouraged by our prayers and personal involvement.


A growing sense of direction and purpose is obvious among us.
