





we are! Albert Einstein best illustrated it when he said, "If my theory of relativity is proven successful Germany will claim me as a German and France will declare I am a citizen of the world. Should my theory prove to be untrue France will say I am a German and Germany will say I am a Jew!"



FICKLE?

You bet! Tragic? It can be! You see, I've noted with amazement and consternation the foolish fickle nature of people who are always looking for something they can never quite identify. Their confusion seems to produce a cynicism that infects almost everyone.

OCCASIONALLY . . .

I hear these marvelous words — "I saw (and they give a name) the other day. She is so delightful. Every time I see her I sense she is together. The neat thing about her is that she's always the same!"

What do they mean? Simply stated, the person being described has found and in turn exudes a confidence and

security that's the envy of all. They are "fickle-less!"

FIRST PERU PROJECT ANNOUNCED

Can you run errands, share your faith, drive a nail, wield a paint brush, hug a sick child, "fix" teeth, lead a Bible study, do eye surgery, teach health care, assist physicians or a dentist?

If you can answer "yes" to even one of the above, God may be calling you to participate in the first project of our Peru Partnership scheduled for late October / early November 1988.

Approximately twenty persons will be needed to fill slots in this EVANGELISM / CONSTRUCTION / MEDICAL MINISTRY. Ideally we will have the following participants:

- ★ four women for visitation, Bible study, errands, etc.
- ★ one experienced builder and three "go-fers"
- ★ two pediatricians
- ★ two ophthalmologists
- ★ one internist or family practitioner
- ★ four to six allied health professionals (men or women)

However, because we believe so strongly that the Lord must lead those who choose to go, the make-up of the final team may differ somewhat from the original plan.

All expenses will be borne by individuals making the trip.

The first thing which anyone desiring to explore the possibility of joining the team should do is to go by Jill's office and get copies of the Peru Partnership document and the Mission Project description.

WHEN YOU ARE READY TO MAKE A DEFINITE COMMITMENT TO GO, YOU SHOULD CALL JILL AT THE CHURCH OFFICE. SHE WILL TAKE YOUR NAME, DATE, AND TIME OF CALL. If more persons desire to go than the project can accommodate, the date of your call will be the determining factor in participation.




