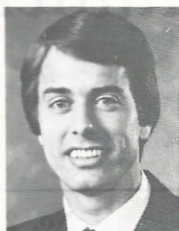

## PERU CHILDREN NEED HELP

Two Baptist churches in the Trujillo area are providing feeding programs for hungry children. The Gethsemane Baptist Church feeds about seventy-five children their noon meal five days a week. These are mostly children who have been abandoned by their fathers and whose mothers have no way of making a living to provide the necessities for their families.

The Gethsemane Church, with Sunday School attendance of around 150, receives outside help only from Southern Baptist Hunger Relief Funds. With the decline in our contributions to hunger relief, the availability of funds has been jeopardized. Church members, as well as missionary Mary Jo French, who works with them, are determined to keep the program going.

The church is also in a building program to provide more adequate space for education and worship; members are also working with a mission which they have established in another needy area.

FBC'S PROJECT ONE will focus some attention on this church and its efforts to serve needy children and share the Bread of Life with people in their area. Listen for God's call to you to participate, and pray for the plans and preparation of those going.

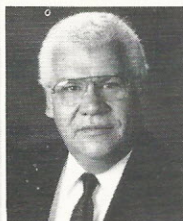

### EVANGELISM TRAINING . . .

is not an optional matter for the family of faith in our kind of world. We've recently completed the first CWT cycle graduating nine (9) people who committed themselves to thirteen (13) weeks of intensive training. They distinguished themselves both in faithfulness and the willingness to complete the work.



### RECOGNITION . . .

of their work and commitment is the "order for the day" Sunday. These, along with others, will make a difference in our City. Please pray for these plus all those who will be trained in our second cycle. "Equipping the saints" has never been optional. It's a mandate of our Lord that must be obeyed.

### EVANGELISM METHODS . . .

are varied and many. I am often reminded that there is *Oikos Evangelism*, *Friendship Evangelism* and *Market Place Evangelism*. That's absolutely true, and may I add in addition to CWT there's:

- E.E. (Evangelism Explosion);
- L.E.S. (Lay Evangelism Schools);
- Roman Road to Salvation;

- Tract Evangelism, etc., etc.

The key is not various methods - but implementation of at least one primary training method. I have chosen two training tools:

- (1) CWT (Continuing Witness Training);
- (2) LES (Lay Evangelism School).

The methods - that is - learning the Gospel presentation - is not optional no matter the method. You and I must learn to share our faith - then - share with family members, friends, neighbors - as Oscar Thompson wrote, our *Concentric Circles of Concern*.

### THE PRIORITY . . .

of our Lord is clearly and convincingly seen in His visit with Zaccheus. Following His conversation with Zaccheus the murmuring crowd needed addressing. Jesus said, "Today salvation has come to this house . . . the Son of Man has come to seek and save that which was lost." His priority is my priority and our priority. No matter how expansive and well-meaning our social concerns - our bed-rock commitment must be that of sharing the Good News. The goal of the Good News is release, restoration - indeed - regeneration.

### The Last Temptation of Jesus . . .

is the title of a soon to be released movie by Universal Studios. Much conversation has already taken place by way of James Dobson and others. I think you should know the *facts* as they are currently known.

#### The facts are . . .

(1) Universal Studios has produced and is releasing the movie for showing September 23, 1988.

(2) The movie was shown to invited guests July 12, 1988, in New York.

(3) The movie is the same movie rumored in 1983. The protests were so significant that it stopped in production.

(4) The current release has been edited and rewritten significantly but continues to show a horribly skewed concept of Jesus our Lord.

(5) The movie reportedly shows Jesus lapsing into a coma-like state and fantasizing about a sexual affair with Mary Magdalene. There is much nudity as well as much that is offensive to the believer.

(6) Ken Penland - promoter of *Chariots of Fire* - reportedly resigned in protest because Universal did not rewrite so that the Christian Community would not be offended and because the screening and release dates were set too close to allow additional editing.

These are the facts as I know them.

#### My opinions . . .

are another matter! I have several strongly held opinions that I feel compelled to share.

(1) This is not a "fundamentalist" issue. The news story of July 14, 1988, is not only incorrect, it is utter nonsense to suggest a radical group of fundamentalists are the only people concerned.

(2) It is not an issue of censorship. I'm not impressed with running out the censorship accusation every time this type issue surfaces.

(3) Citing the Biblical truth of . . . "Jesus was tempted in all manner as we are yet without sin" . . . as justification for this release is misrepresentation at best, sacrilegious at worst. The scenes are creations of the writers, not the fantasy of Christ. There is neither Biblical nor historical base for such creation.

My suggestions are as follows:

- 1. Write Universal. Be kind, be gentle, be firm. Never use threatening or offensive language.

- 2. Write local theater managers and ask them not to show the movie because of its offensive nature.
