

Maguire State Mission Offering



The Maguire State Mission Offering is designed to address Florida's mission and ministry needs which otherwise would not be met through regular Cooperative Program gifts. The offering will provide financial resources to underwrite traditions as well as new and innovative mission and ministry approaches.

The final object of each of these mission and ministry approaches is to create the climate whereby others will hear the Good News of Jesus Christ. Through this offering, Florida Baptists can share the joy in that proclamation.

"Florida is the greatest mission field anywhere in the United States," observed John Maguire, former executive secretary-treasurer of the Florida Baptist Convention. "And unless Florida Baptists arise to the occasion of reaching these lost people, we are going to be going backwards, instead of forward."

The 1988 Maguire State Mission Offering will provide financial assistance: in the start and development of mission churches; for emergency aid to pastors in Florida's partnership states; and to United Christian Action's program of moral education.

reward. The church of our Lord must have those committed to faithful attendance, stewardship and a positive spirit toward reaching our world for Christ.

CARING!

"The friendly family of First Baptist Church" must be more than a neat slogan. We must consistently demonstrate a love for others found first in Jesus Christ.

COOPERATIVE!

It's our toughest one. The bruising of business life causes much suspicion — sometimes producing an adversarial relationship. All of us know churches who are stressed with division. We grieve over the stress. My prayer is that we would establish the model for a life venture of cooperation and mutual respect.

CONGENIAL!

I'm speaking of more than warmth. I'm speaking of our being ambassadors for Christ, extending a friendly, loving hand to the City.

The five "C's" are not optional. They are difficult. Join me as we implement the five "C's" in this terrific fellowship.
