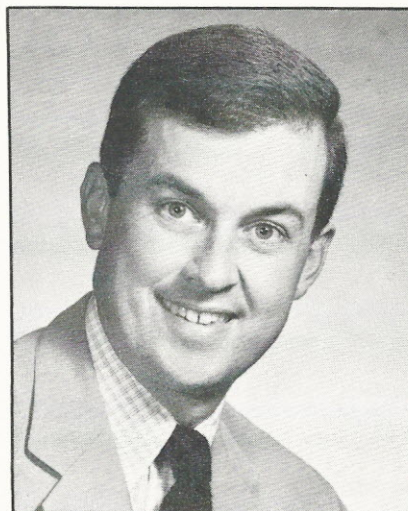

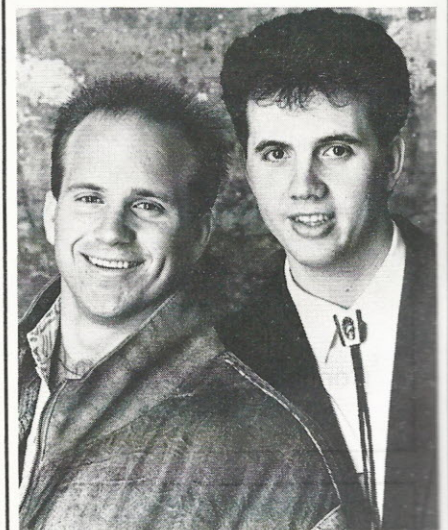
BOOK REVIEW

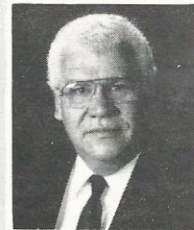

The Committee For The Future . . .

is set to report Sunday evening, September 18. The entire evening service will be given to a full presentation and discussion. I am urging you to join us, receive full information and adopt a process that will take us to the year 2000.



The report is at the printer and will be mailed to you September 8th. You will have plenty of time to read the report recently adopted by our deacon group.

Several important . . .

matters related to the report must be clearly understood. I feel compelled to share these concerns with you:

— 1. The CFTF report is *not* the final report. That is, we *are not* voting September 18 to go forward with the nine recommendations. We will vote to appoint committees who are to complete:

- a). A thorough study;
- b). A full investigation of cost, needs and scope of possibilities;
- c). A full report and recommen-

dation that will come to our deacons and to the church in conference. After we approve the committee's final report we will proceed with the plans as adopted.

— 2. The current CFTF report is the first step. This first step has required an enormous amount of investigation. The sub-committees did not prepare details. They were charged with the responsibility of determining direction. Their findings will be turned over to the committee charged with bringing us detailed plans.

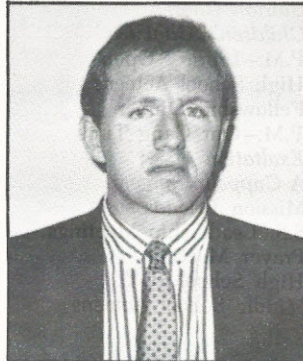
If we . . .
