NEWS FROM YOUR . . .



OUR SANCTUARY CHOIR CONTINUES TO ADD SIGNIFICANTLY TO OUR WORSHIP EXPERIENCES. I'm so appreciative of the genuinely *hard work* this group puts into preparing thier praise offerings. This, on top of rehearsing the MESSIAH for Chrstmas, is quite a challenge . . . but one they are up to meeting!

GOD HAS PLACED A BURDEN ON MY HEART TO INVOLVE MORE PEOPLE IN OUR SANCTUARY CHOIR. This can be done only with your cooperation. Let me encourage prospects to use as your criterion for joining, or not joining choir, "do I have a talent to contribute?" . . . not, "they already have enough without me." The truth is, we can seat 150 members each Sunday with a little rearranging; last Sunday we had 100 members in our service choir. As you can see, there's plenty of room for more. 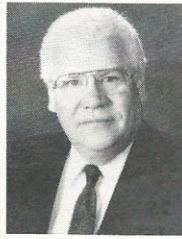
## BASKETBALL
