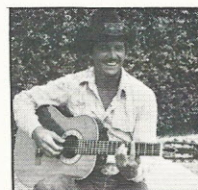

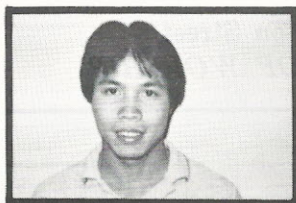

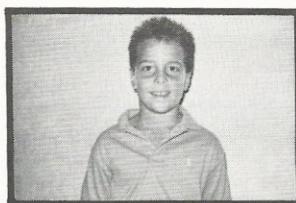

Eckerd, Finding The Right Prescription

From super-successful business to high government service, then candidate for public office, Jack Eckerd continued to seek self-fulfillment, only to recognize a discontent and inner emptiness in his later years. Revealing an ambitious, perfectionistic nature in making this climb, this self-made drugstore-chain magnate nevertheless maintained a warm, personal touch with his employees, feeling this to be the key to successful management.

Eckerd's late-in-life conversion experience, his inner struggle in coming to grips with that, and his dedicated service afterwards give a moving personal witness to Christ's transforming power.

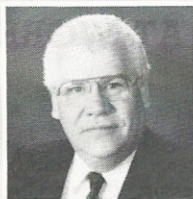
Basketball season is right around the corner. The Recreation Committee needs Coaches and Assistant Coaches for all teams in our five leagues.

ATMOSPHERE . . .

what a tremendous word. For some, the word means a clean environment. For



others it means the amenities of the immediate surroundings. Still others think of atmosphere as that intangible ingredient that impacts either positively or negatively.

The one thing all of us agree on, creating atmosphere is essential — and the creation of a positive, healthy atmosphere releases possibility thinking that dramatically impacts every factor and phase of life.

A POSITIVE . . .

healthy atmosphere is absolutely essential for a church family — especially one gifted, called and commissioned to meet the ever-growing needs of a city like ours. We must never take the responsibility of developing a healthy climate for God's work lightly.

THERE ARE . . .

four characteristics that describe a healthy, dynamic atmosphere in and through which Christ Jesus can work.

— 1. PRIORITY.

The atmosphere must be charged with a common commitment to the one task our Lord gave Himself to. He leaves no room for misunderstanding when we read Him. "To seek and to save the lost"

must not be lost in our frantic effort to do programs originating from every imaginable direction.

— 2. PRAYER.

I am fully convinced that the one missing ingredient in our life together is that of prayer. Check it out *honestly* in your own life. How much or how little time does prayer occupy in your life? Check your commitment to prayer. The truth is — to know the will of God requires us to spend the time with Him in prayer so as to develop our relationship.

— 3. PRAISE.

I'm talking joy, celebration, creating in each of us the natural ability to give thanks to our Father. Anger, depression and withdrawal flows freely from us when God does not respond as we want. How selfish of us. To know Him is to love and praise Him even when we don't feel like it!

— 4. PURITY.

We will not long survive if we do not give attention to the affirming work of God. It's so easy to criticize, second-guess and whisper against another. We've seen the national political campaigns take on character assassination. We must forge a people who delightedly create atmosphere — an atmosphere that reflects the priority of Jesus Christ.

It's never easy to build atmosphere. It is essential for all of us. I'll see you 1500 strong as we gather to celebrate Sunday.
