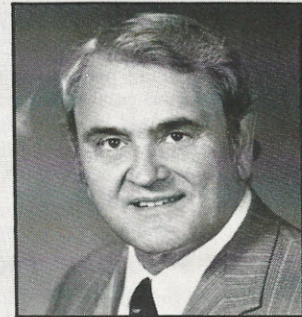
CHALLENGER AWARD HOMECOMING TWENTY YEAR ANNIVERSARY

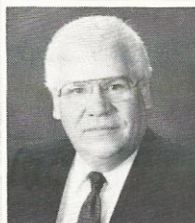

The Seagle Say:

Mrs. John McGuire . . .



is a wonderful lady who does not hesitate to speak both clearly and forcefully to needs. She is the wife of the late Dr. John McGuire, former Executive Director of the Florida Baptist Convention.

Several wonderful video clips were shown during the recent Convention of Mrs. McGuire and "Dr. John" speaking powerfully for the Cooperative Program — our life line for missions. I was both challenged and stirred by their obvious vision for the work of Christ world-wide.

A quote . . .

by Mrs. McGuire will not let me go. She said — "We need leaders who are more interested in building the Kingdom of God instead of an empire!"

That cut — spoke — probed and caused me to re-evaluate my own motive and priorities as a pastoral leader.

Kingdom or empire . . .

how could we determine which is being built? I'm not sure I have a full answer — but I do believe there are several telling signs.

An empire may be on the way when:

(1) The pastor and church totally withdraw from the greater family of faith. The reason for withdrawal is usually — "We're just too busy!"

(2) Local programs — i.e. — buildings, ministry, staff, etc. are put together and maintained at the expense of a world-

wide missions program. The justifications are always varied and sometimes interesting.

(3) Suspicion is raised about other pastors and churches with veiled, yet destructive accusations — i.e. — "liberal" — or "fundamentalist" — or — "moderate" — or — "conservative" — labeling in order to draw people to the empire.

I could go on — but I won't. I want to be a "Kingdom of God" man and I desperately want us to be a "Kingdom of God" church.

Tanzania . . .

was in the spotlight in our recent Convention. I heard two moving testimonies. I heard Mr. and Mrs. Doug Knapp, long-time missionaries to Tanzania, Africa. Quietly, modestly, humbly Doug spoke of the mighty move of God in that land. In 25 years Doug baptized "with my own hands" more than 24,000 converts. That, my friend, is a Kingdom of God man.

Ayubu Mwakalinga . . .

a slight, committed, African pastor has:

— started more than 82 churches;

— baptized "with his own hands" more than 10,000 fellow Tanzanians;

— baptized already this year 2,700 new converts. That, my friend, is a "Kingdom of God" pastor! We must see beyond ourselves to a world in need of Jesus Christ.

Lottie Moon . . .

offers us the first and finest opportunity to say to our world — "We are a Kingdom of God church." We must surpass \$86,000 on December 18th — Victory Day '88.

I'll see you 1500 strong Sunday.

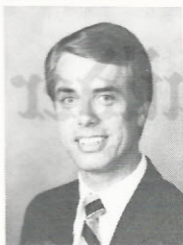

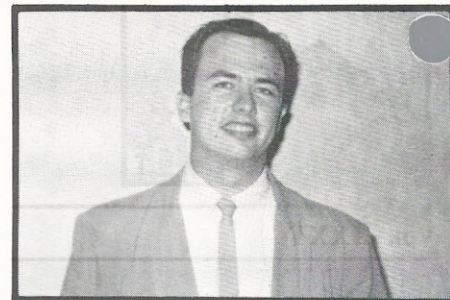

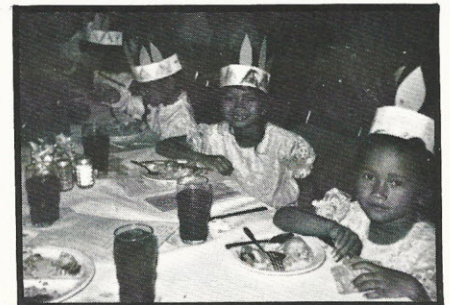
