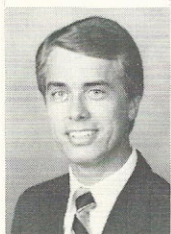
ECUADOR MISSION TEAM

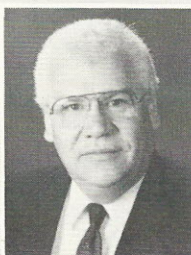

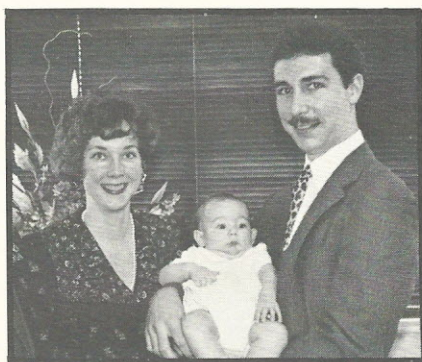

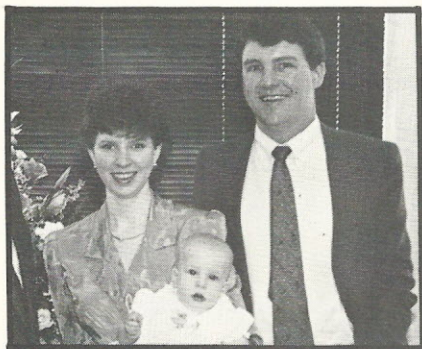
