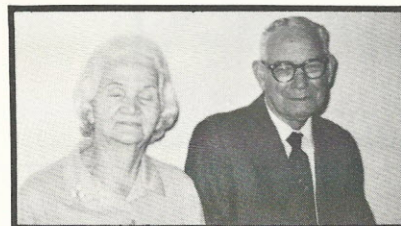
3) **CHAPEL CHOIR PREPARES FOR TOUR '89**

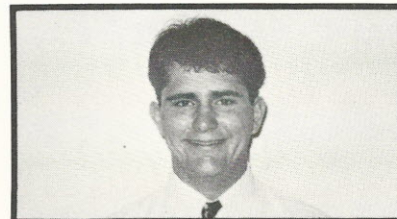

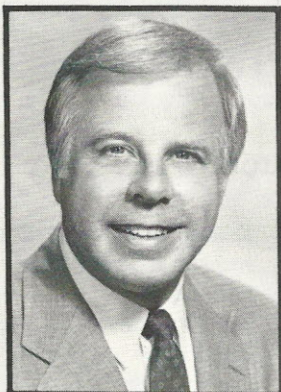

"Body Life" . . .

is how California pastor Ray Stedman describes life inside the family of faith — the church. The question that comes to me is — "but what does Stedman mean?"

I'm sure we cannot afford to miss the intent, emphasis and concept of Jesus as He speaks to us regarding "Body Life."

Relationships . . .

that are viable, wholesome, redemptive and encouraging are difficult to maintain. Critics of the church have been numerous — and at times — on target. We have not always taken our Lord, the Apostle Paul or John seriously. All three persistently call us to horizontal relationships that are wholesome and encouraging. The Scripture calls encouragers "edifiers" — those who build up the family of faith.

The Critics . . .

of the church frequently cite the "shooting of the wounded" as the basic mind set and habit of the people who call

themselves "Church." I'm not sure the critic is accurate. I am sure we need to become encouragers, "edifiers" — those who build the family of faith.

How do . . .

we practically and honestly develop "Body Life" that reflects the Lord of Life? There are six (6) suggestions I feel will help us.

— 1. Exercise patience with those you find difficult to understand and relate to.

— 2. Develop an attitude that lets you see the best — not the worst in those around you.

— 3. Ask yourself why you tend to critically view those around you — if in fact that's your tendency.

— 4. "Telling it like it is" must never be license to disturb and destroy those who are struggling with life.

— 5. Develop a healthy sense of acceptance, accepting people for who they are, not who we want them to be.

— 6. Expect and look for the best, not the worst in those who share life with us in and through the Body of Christ.

Are these easy suggestions? Absolutely not — but they are vital.

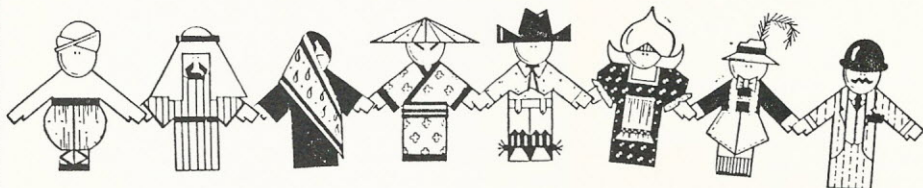

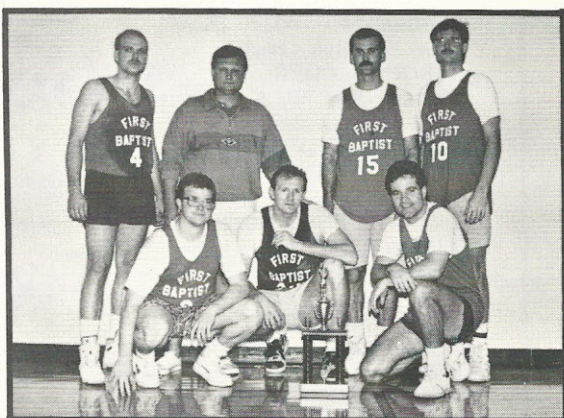
