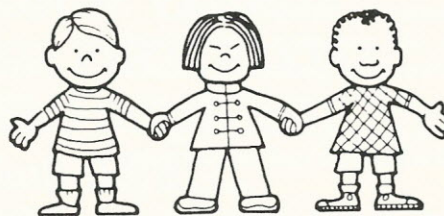

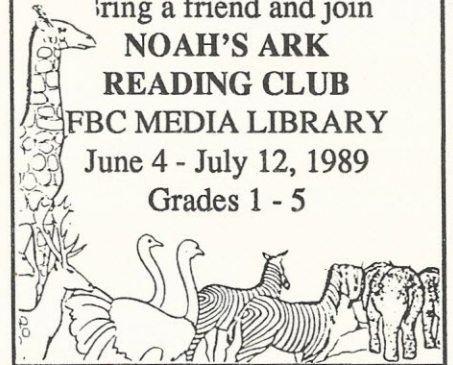

Bring your lunch - drinks will be provided.

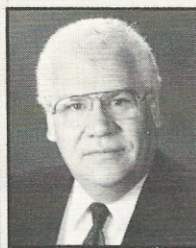

ALL THE CHILDREN OF THE BIBLE by Herbert Lockyer. Zondervan, c1970.

An extensive resource for an in-depth look at the role of children in Bible times. Includes divine purpose, child/parent relations, personal traits, training, care, and conduct, etc., with engaging childhood portraits drawn of some. An Appendix also lists and quotes helpful resources in children's literature, including stories, poems, hymns, and prayers.

THE SEAGLE SAY:



Pace-setting...

is not a safe place to be! Frankly, it's the only place to be! The cold, hard facts are tough to swallow. Pace-setting has fallen on hard times.

The trend, the tendency, is to:

-1. participate in a "cookie-cutting" experiment. Don't be different. Let's all look, act and think alike -- is what "cookie cutting" looks like.

-2. become franchisers. It works well with burgers and pizza, but it's not the way of Christ. Franchising means either the denomination or someone else of power and influence formulates programs that all must implement. Borrowing what others have struggled with, prayed over, tailored and implemented does not -- in fact, cannot assure success everywhere it's tried.

A classic...

example was the coffee-house ministry of a Washington, D.C., congregation. They agonized, prayed and struggled over the mind of Christ and the will of God. The plan was launched with tremendous success. Soon church leaders flocked in to see, study and borrow their concept. Failures were numerous and at times embarrassing.

You see, there's a vast difference in looking at the ministry of someone else and

assuming that's the way it must be for all.

The Biblical...

pattern is clear for individuals and churches. The pattern tells us:

- 1. we are all unique;
- 2. we are all gifted;
- 3. we have a God-given ministry;
- 4. that ministry can be fully discovered by all who seek the Holy Spirit's leadership;
- 5. that borrowing from others without specific spiritual leadership is both dangerous and wrong;
- 6. we must fully explore the will, mind and heart of God -- then set the pace in:
 - * teaching; * missions;
 - * preaching, * ministry;
 - * evangelism;

A.W. Tozer...

in a book Paths To Power wrote: "The church must have power; she must become formidable, a moral force to be reckoned with, if she would regain her lost position of spiritual ascendancy and make her message the revolutionizing, conquering thing it once was."

That's pace-setting! It's also living on the cutting edge. Pensacola deserves a pace-setting family of faith on this hill. Let's do it for His glory!
