





Suspicion...

anger, ill-will and bitterness hangs over our nation's capital like a dense fog. You understand - I am not into partisan politics. Like you, I am an observer of the human scene.

Frankly, it isn't a pretty sight.

Practically every political leader in Washington has spent more hours in meetings and conversation concerning rumor and strife than in governing. While normal in these circumstances, it's still a counter-productive time.

My fear...

is that of "spill-over." If we aren't careful the same spirit of suspicion and division that grips Washington may invade our churches. When that happens everyone loses!

There's a big difference in Washington's loss and ours. When the family of faith gets side-tracked the losses may well have eternal consequences. Do you remember the Acts 6 scene? It's a scene:

- much like that of Washington;
- filled with suspicion;
- rumors flying;
- people divided;
- direction hard to find.

The family of faith came together, sought healing, found a new sense of renewal and direction - the result being a mighty outpouring of God's Spirit upon them.

My prayer...

is that our Heavenly Father will:

-1. Protect us from the pervasive suspicion and division that surrounds our nation's capital;

-2. Use the current difficulties as a time of teaching and as a warning to the people of God;

-3. Sensitize us to the needs of a lost world, assist us in establishing the priority of Christ and provide us the boldness to share His love.

The summer needs our attention and attendance! Let's make it our most exciting - in fact - our very best!
