





MEDIA CENTER BOOK REVIEW

SIGN'S UP by Vick Vickery. Good Sign Publishing Co., Little Rock, Arkansas, c1988.

"Vignettes of comedy and character" compiled by the author during more than forty years of Boy Scout work. Challenged by the trail signs of Scouting and the rich material of the Scout Oath and Law, he entitles his inspirational chapters Signs--of Direction, Life, Nature, Danger, etc., clearly pointing the reader to "a right turn in life."

Author Vick Vickery recently retired from professional Scouting and with wife, Ann, returned to Pensacola and First Baptist Church where they served faithfully many years before transfer to Arkansas, he as Sunday School Superintendent and Deacon; Ann as Sunday School teacher. Congratulations to our newly published author and a glad welcome back, Vick and Ann.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CHURCH CORPORATION

All members of the church congregation are also automatically members of the church corporation, First Baptist Church of Pensacola, Inc., chartered as a non-profit corporation under the laws of Florida. Originally, the function of the corporation has been limited to holding legal title to all of the church real estate and executing all contracts, mortgages, deeds, and other legal instruments relating to real estate. Under revised bylaws adopted in 1982, the corporation was also assigned the responsibility of administering and investing funds contributed to the church by special gift or bequest and other reserve funds. To oversee the investment of all of these funds, and to encourage additional gifts and bequests, the bylaws directed that a Foundation Committee be established. 1983 was the first full year in which the corporation and its Foundation Committee have had these additional responsibilities.

We are pleased to submit this report identifying the funds under administration with their fund and interest balances at December 31, 1988. The funds are grouped in accordance with the purposes for which they were given.

MISSION FUNDS

1. Invested earnings distributed annually 2/3 to Lottie Moon Offering and 1/3 to Annie Armstrong Offering. First established in 1976 with over \$200,000 given by an anonymous couple and added to by others with the total gifts being \$202,475. Interest earned and distributed \$14,323.10.
2. Invested earnings distributed annually 1/4 to Home Missions, 1/4 to State Missions and 1/2 to Foreign Missions. Established in 1976 from the estate of Mrs. Claudia C. McCurley. Total gifts \$1,419.78. Interest earned and distributed \$122.74.

FUNDS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE OR THEIR ACTIVITIES

3. Invested earnings to be used to assist girls in attending camp. Donated by Harvey Hedrick Missionary Group in memory of Nancy E. Allen in 1976. Recipients to be selected by Mission Action Chairman of WMU in consultation with church staff. Total gifts \$1,032.25. Interest earned ('88) \$85.29; available funds \$762.73.
4. Invested earnings to be used to assist young people in attending Foreign Mission Week at Ridgecrest and if not used in any year to be added to Lottie Moon Offering. Donated by Miss Annie (Nan) Beggs in 1973 in memory of her father, Judge E. D. Beggs (1861-1940). Total gifts \$5,000.00. Interest earned in 1987 of \$322.97 was sent to Lottie Moon Offering. Interest earned ('88) \$411.49; available funds \$411.49.
5. Invested earnings to be used to foster youth work of the church. Established in 1980 by a gift of \$5500 from Mrs. E. F. Dunbar in memory of her daughter, Dolly McGowin. Interest earned ('88) \$439.62; available funds \$966.64.
6. Invested earnings to be used to help students attending Pensacola Junior College, University of West Florida, or other educational institutions in that order of priority in allocation of funds. Known as College Scholarship Fund, first established in 1981 by a gift from Mr. and Mrs. Sandy Sansing and added to by gifts from Mrs. H. T. Dukes, William Gill and in 1988 a gift of \$4,000 from the estate of Mrs. Ruby Greenhut. Total gifts \$36,574.90. Interest earned ('88) \$2,277.31; available funds \$1,041.60. A Fund Committee established by the church awards the scholarships. In 1988 six students were helped.
7. In 1986 a gift of \$1,000 was given by the Lon Roberts family in his memory and memorial gifts from others totaled \$1,343.50. Invested earnings to be used to send youths to church camps. Total gifts \$2,343.50. Interest earned ('88) \$133.69; available funds \$326.43.

FUNDS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF NEW CHAPEL

8. A gift in 1976 from the estate of Earl Gaston of \$21,942.94 was the start of this fund. This has had wide appeal to our members with other gifts and earned interest totaling \$132,023.08. Interest earned ('88) \$10,996.77 making the fund balance \$164,962.79.
9. A bequest under the will of Mrs. Hazel W. Coleman in 1981 for establishing or assisting a church or mission in an inadequately churched area or, if impracticable, then in construction or furnishing a new chapel. Original bequest \$6,946.20 with interest in previous years of \$3,266.59 and interest ('88) of \$395.31 makes the fund balance \$10,608.10.
10. An anonymous member gave a real estate mortgage in June 1987 in the amount of \$5,878. Monthly payments of \$100 (principal and interest) go to this fund. Principal Balance December 31, 1988, \$4,650.70. If paid off "on schedule" this will reach a total of \$7,485.56 over the pay-off period of approximately 6 years. This fund designated for building a chapel.

GENERAL RESERVE FUNDS

11. In 1984, Mrs. Georgia Parker, through her estate, gave her property in East Pensacola which netted to the church when sold \$27,072.51, and in the same year Mrs. Jan Ainslie, through her estate, gave property and cash which netted to the church \$28,079.99. No restrictions were placed on these two funds which have been used through the years to purchase two parcels in the block near the church where paving only exists and to purchase three parcels in Block 87 (Guillemand, Jackson, Tarragona and LaRua). In 1988 additional monies from these funds were used to purchase the 4-unit apartment property on Jackson Street (\$35,000 to take possession in October 1991) and to purchase the corner of Tarragona-LaRua (\$8500). Fund balance (Parker) \$441.20 and fund balance (Ainslie) \$1,873.18.
12. In 1979 Carrie Lee, through her estate, left to the church \$9,272. Soon after her bequest, the church used a portion of this to make sanctuary repairs and to pay other maintenance expenses. Interest earned ('88) \$265.69. Fund balance \$1,069.06.

MEMORIAL GIFT PROGRAM

The Foundation Committee inaugurated in the last half of 1983 a plan to receive gifts made to the church in memory of deceased persons and also to honor living persons. A very attractive "Book of Remembrance" is in the church vestibule under glass. The name of each person honored by a gift to this fund, whether living or deceased, will be recorded in this "Book of Remembrance".

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CHURCH CORPORATION (CONTINUED)

The names of the donors will be published in *The First Baptist Builder* and kept on record in the church office. Attractive acknowledgement cards are sent to each donor and an announcement of the gift is sent to the bereaved family or to the honored living person.

13. Foundation Memorial Fund: Memorial gifts designated for this Fund under the program described above, as well as all undesignated memorial gifts, will be accumulated in this fund and permanently invested. The principal will be held inviolate. The income, upon approving vote of the congregation specifying as unanticipated emergency need other than budgeted items, current expenses, previously incurred obligations and the like, may be applied to such need. Unexpended income will be accumulated. Interest earned ('88) \$968.13; Fund balance \$18,628.56.
- Gifts may be for designated purposes such as the Foundation Memorial Fund, the library, the building fund, Missions offerings, or as additions to any of the funds listed above. Undesignated memorial gifts are placed in the Foundation Memorial Fund for permanent investment.

SPECIAL PURPOSE FUNDS

14. Contributions from several members of the Board of Directors and of the Foundation Committee to cover general expenses of the Corporation. Balance on hand is \$203.15.
15. An anonymous church family gave previous gifts of \$9,100 and added to that in 1988 another gift of \$1250. The designated use of this fund is to purchase vehicles for use of the church. Interest earned ('88) \$393.97. Fund balance \$7,666.67.

REAL ESTATE HELD IN TRUST

16. The property of 4.1 acres on University Parkway acquired in 1968 for a use that never developed was sold in December 1988. This sale netted to the church \$105,498.26. In December 1988 the church acquired the only property (Mitchell) in the sanctuary block not owned by the church. The total purchase price was \$65,000 with payment of \$5,000 on closing, \$5,000 in December of the next three years and a final payment of \$45,000. The church voted to establish a fund titled Property Acquisition Fund using the \$105,498.26 and designating the use of the original amount and interest earned to meet the payments to Mitchell and purchase any property in Block 87 that becomes available.
17. Ray and Marion Edwards gave to the Church Lots 7 and 8, Block 122, Maxent Tract in December, 1986. This property has been appraised at \$4,500.00 and is presently being offered for sale. Use not designated.

A WORD OF APPRECIATION

The Board of Directors of the Corporation and the members of the Foundation Committee greatly appreciate the gifts and bequests detailed in this report, and the wonderful acceptance of the church membership of the Memorial Gift program. We encourage all church members who are in a position to do so to put their financial affairs in order so as to make gifts during their lifetime and at death to bequest, through a will out of their material blessings, gifts to demonstrate their love for our Heavenly Father and their desire to promote the establishment of His Kingdom. Additions may be made to any of these established funds or for other designated purposes approved by the church.
