PERU: PERSON-TO-PERSON

Missionary Sherra Armstrong writes that Peruvians have experienced **10,000 percent** (yes, 10,000) inflation since our first trip to Peru in March 1988. Government leadership is in turmoil, terrorist activity is increasing daily, and the people are struggling just to survive.

Some people are eating soup made of water and chicken feed. Even middle class citizens manage only one or two meals a day. Companies producing medicine have left the country and present supplies are almost depleted. Any new medicine will come from China, according to local reports.

This is the situation facing our Peruvian friends and our missionaries. It is the reason why Rodolph Dixon, area missionary who guides our partnership work, has stated:

"Neither you nor we can solve the overwhelming problems here. What we really need for you to do is to **train our people to express their faith effectively and help them to have the courage and dignity to live through crisis times.**"

To assist with this task, four FBC members will leave July 12 to join two others in Trujillo for eleven days of work with the Baptist churches of that area.

Betty and Jack Logsdon, Jennifer Smith, and Martha Trotter will arrive in Trujillo on Thursday, July 13. Along with Barbara Starr and Rachel White, who will remain after the annual Mission Meeting, they will be working in most of the fourteen churches which make up the Trujillo association.

Dixon has asked that the team be prepared 1) to train church members in witness visitation and to do follow-up visitation of prospects with them; 2) to train VBS/Big A Club leadership; 3) to hold workshop sessions on family relationships and/or critical issues for youth.

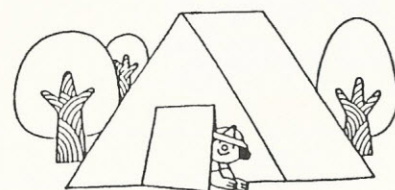

5. Hong Kong has been selected by the Foreign Mission Board as one of two cities in the world for a "major city" emphasis. Pray that, as the planning begins, the Hong Kong Baptist Convention and our local mission will know how best to take advantage of this opportunity to reach this city of over five and a half million people.

- We all observe "no visitors" signs. If we are to be an exception, please let us know.

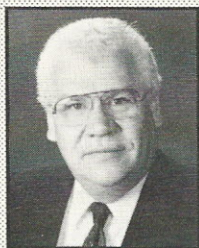
-2. Homebound Ministry.
