

BOOK REVIEWS

A SAVIOR FOR ALL SEASONS by William P. Barker. Fleming H. Revell, c1986. (232.3 Bar)

Editor of Tarbell's Teacher's Guide, author, and pastor, Dr. Barker defines the warm, supportive, sustaining relationship available in Christ. Helpful reassurances for life's crisis moments--loneliness, moral failure, self-doubt, conflicts, spiritual dryness, grief, aging, guilt, etc.

BESS W. TRUMAN by Margaret Truman. Macmillan, c1986. (B Tru)

Margaret Truman draws a lovingly detailed portrait of her strong-willed, privacy-preferring mother, using personally remembered vignettes and revealing quotes gleaned from extensive personal correspondence at which the Trumans excelled.

From prominent maternal and paternal families, Bess, popular and sports-minded, was in part shaped by the tragedy surrounding her father's death and a complex relationship with her dependent mother. Forging strong character and ideals through this, she went on to become a sustaining partner in an enduring marriage and a protective, supportive mother, in an arena not of her choice.
