July 23, 30 and August 6

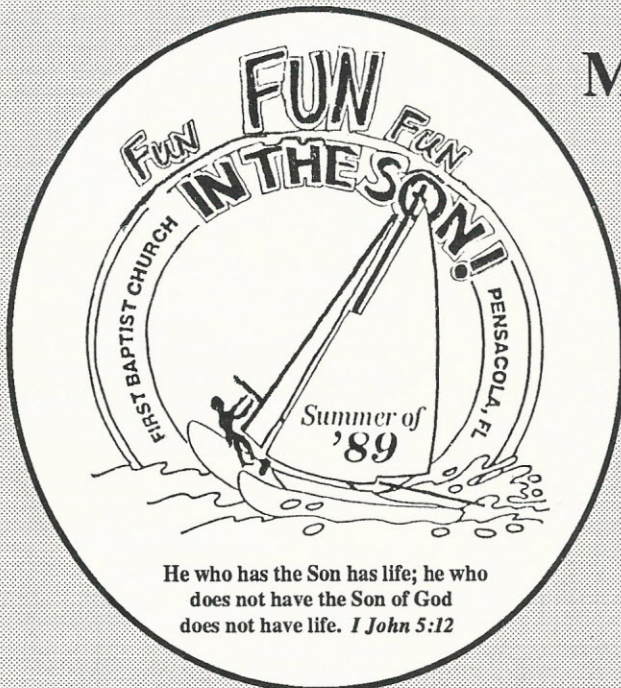
July 23 - This special **two-hour session** is scheduled from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

relationship is a healthy relationship. Our missionaries live with some tension and in several cases, real danger. The Peruvian economy is shattered. Poverty is rampant. Lostness is pervasive. Disease and hunger is extensive. Clothing needs are urgent.

Our partnership with Trujillo is both appropriate and vital. I have several urgent recommendations to our Missions Committee that will help us place in priority form the projects that will help expand God's Kingdom in Trujillo.

I'll write more later. Please pray for Hayward and Sherri Armstrong as well as Rodolf and May Dixon; Gary and Sandy Light, Mary Jo French, Wade and Nancy Watts. They are God's choicest servants, open to dynamic leadership and visionary response.

In the meantime--let's reach 1500 in Sunday School and pray for a mighty outpouring of the Father upon us.

Thank you for faithful prayer support. Continue to pray for Martha Trotter, Jack and Betty Logsdon, Jennifer Smith, Rachel White and Barbara Starr. They have a heavy schedule to maintain.
