

Focus!

What a terrific word!

Focus means:

- clarity
- without "fuzziness;"
- sharpness;
- crispness;
- that priority has

been established.

Focus...

is the toughest thing in the world for a congregation serious about following Jesus Christ. There are reasons for such difficulty.

- 1. Political aspirants need votes.
- 2. Lobbyists need signatures.
- 3. Social action, civic and moral concern groups need help. The best place in the world to get that help is--you guessed it--the church!

My weeks...

are filled with those who have concerns--most of which are legitimate--and who strongly believe I must make their organization and concern my number one priority. Like every pastor across America, I'm:

- confronted;
- cajoled; --and
- pressured to make whatever the movement, concern or issue may be my personal focus as well as the focus of the Family of Faith!

The problem, any issue or movement that moves the Family of Faith away from a New Testament focus is dangerous! "What is the New Testament focus?" you ask. The focus, the priority of the New Testament is:

- 1. Evangelism and Missions
Mankind--worldwide--without Jesus Christ is eternally lost. Our mandate tell them about God's wonderful gift of love and life through Jesus Christ.

-2. Discipleship and Christ-like-ness.

Once born into His Kingdom we must persistently seek to become like He is. The task of Sunday School and training events is the task of making disciples.

-3. Building fellowship.

Living together in unity is a Biblical mandate. Differences are not dangerous unless they become disruptive, antagonistic and vengeful. Acts 6 tells us the Holy spirit is quenched where reconciled family is missing.

My focus...

is forever bound to those three New Testament precepts and priorities. Within those three is room for personal involvement in social concerns, political activity and moral movements. Focus, however, will never allow us to substitute the secondary for the priority.

Bottom-line!

How long has it been since you:

- 1. sat down with someone and shared with them how you came to receive Christ and then led that person to pray to receive Him?--or--Invited, simply invited, them to be your guest where the Gospel is shared in grace and love?

- 2. invested time in Master Life, the Navigators or in a course of personal study that grows you toward Christ-like-ness?

- 3. wrote a note of thanks, shared a word of praise, spent some time in prayer for your brothers and sisters in the Family of Faith, determined to build them up in the faith?

Focus...

dear friends, focus--there's no option for us!

See you 1500 strong as we study together Sunday.
